Language to Avoid

Be careful about using the word "registration" in any posts or materials created. The vote-by-mail reset does <u>not</u> affect a voter's voter registration, and we don't want voters to think this affects their ability to vote in person.

ALT Text

LWVFL encourages using ALT Text where applicable. Twitter offers an easy way to add custom ALT Text. Facebook & Instagram are programmed to generate their own but can be edited/customized if deemed necessary.

One of the most important reasons to use ALT text is for the use of accessibility programs designed for audio and visually impaired individuals. These programs offer alternative methods of website browsing but require descriptive titles and captions that can be scanned and processed. For example, an individual with a visual disability or impairment may use a program that reads text aloud as they browse a webpage. With descriptive text, the program reads the description of the image, inferring the contents and the location of the image within the text. Without descriptive text, the program may skip the image altogether or offer a notice to the user that no description is offered.

- Image 1 & 3: An image primarily made up of text depicting the following: FLORIDA VOTERS, IT'S TIME TO RE-REQUEST YOUR VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT!
- Image 2 & 4: An image primarily made up of text depicting the following: [BLANK] COUNTY VOTERS, IT'S TIME TO RE-REQUEST YOUR VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT.

Public Service Announcement Language

• Hey, Florida voter! Are you planning on voting by mail in this year's election? How about in the 2024 general election? If you answered yes to either of these questions then you'll need to submit a NEW vote by mail ballot request. Florida law now requires every voter to request a new vote-by-mail ballot after each election cycle. That means every voter, whether you voted by mail before or not, must submit a new request this year. Don't miss the deadline! Make your voice count and request your ballot today by visiting allvoting.org/FLVoteByMail. For questions, call the nonpartisan voter assistance hotline at 866-OUR-VOTE!
