Abstract

Introduction (Cambria, size 13)

The introduction should provide a brief overview of the study within a broader context and emphasize its importance. It should clearly define the study's objective, significance, and relevance. This section must contain a description of the situation analysis or the objective conditions of the subject of community service (assisted community), identifying the issues and focus of the service. The reasons for selecting the community service subject should also be included, along with the expected social changes or community service goals, which should be supported by both qualitative and quantitative data. A review of the current state of research should be presented, highlighting key publications. If applicable, controversial or divergent hypotheses should be addressed. Additionally, the introduction should concisely state the main objective of the work and briefly mention the principal conclusions. This section should be comprehensible to a broad scientific audience, including those from outside the specific research field. References should be cited according to APA style (e.g., Kamba, 2018; Marchlewska et al., 2019; Cichocka, 2016; Hidayat & Khalika, 2019; Ikhwan, 2019; Madjid, 2002; Miller & Josephs, 2009, p. 12; Rakhmat, 1989). Refer to the end of the document for additional details on reference formatting. All technical terms, symbols, abbreviations, and acronyms should be defined the first time they are introduced. Tables

and figures must be cited in numerical order.

Method (Cambria, size 13)

This section contains an explanation of the research approach, the subjects of the study, and the research procedures. It also details the materials and instruments used, the data collection process, and the analysis techniques employed. In the context of community service, it should describe the process of joint community action planning (community organizing), specifying the subjects of community service, the location of the service, and the involvement of the assisted community in the planning and organizing process. The methods or strategies used to achieve the expected goals should be described, and the stages of community service activities should be outlined. 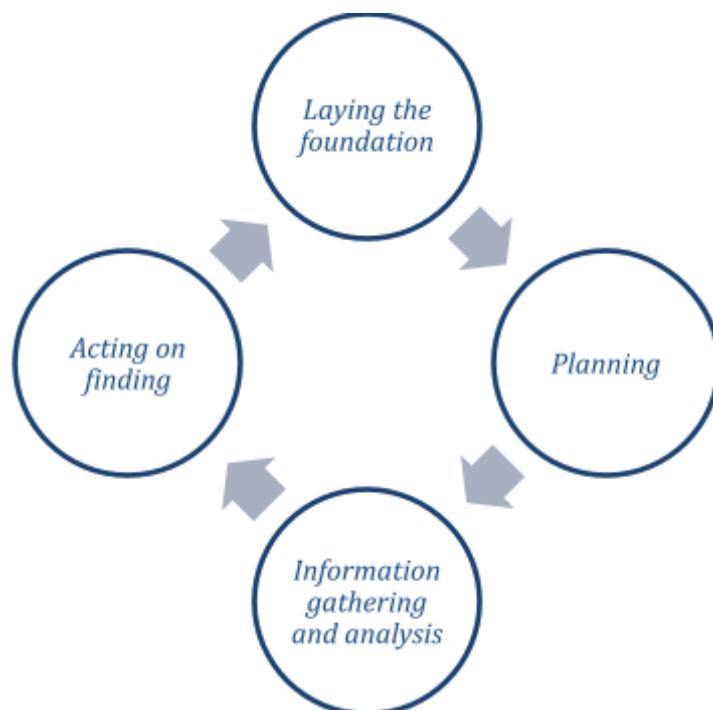


Figure 1. Diagram Examples

Result (Cambria, size 13)

The results obtained from the research must be supported by sufficient data. This section should describe the outcomes of the community service process, detailing the dynamics of the assistance activities, such as the variety of actions undertaken, the forms of technical or program interventions aimed at solving community problems, and the emergence of the expected social changes. These changes may include the formation of new institutions, shifts in behavior, the rise of local leaders, or the development of new awareness towards social transformation. Additionally, the research results and findings should address the research questions or hypotheses outlined in the introduction section. (Cambria, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1.15)

Discussion (Cambria, size 13)

The discussion should provide an interpretation of the results and relate them to the original research question or objectives outlined in the Introduction section. It should also include a description of the community service results, with a theoretical discussion relevant to the findings of the community service process. Authors should explore how the results answer the research questions (what/how), providing scientific interpretation for each result or finding (why). Additionally, the discussion should cover the theoretical findings of the service process, from the initiation of the service activities to the occurrence of social changes. The discussion should address whether the results align with those of previous studies (what else) and highlight any differences if they exist. The findings and their implications should be discussed in the broadest possible context, and future research directions may also be suggested. This section should be supported by relevant theoretical perspectives and references from the literature, following APA style. (Cambria, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1.15)

Conclusion (Cambria, size 13)

The conclusion should answer the objectives of the research and the research discoveries. It should not simply repeat the results and discussions but should reflect on the theoretical implications of the findings and provide recommendations for community service based on these results. This section should offer a theoretical reflection on how the findings contribute to understanding the community service process and highlight the expected or actual social changes. Authors should also suggest future research directions and point out any ongoing studies that may extend the work. (Cambria, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1.15)
