

Intro To Thrawn:

- BBY = Before the Battle of Yavin = Before A New Hope, Episode 4 = 0 BBY
- ABY = After the Battle of Yavin = After the end of A New Hope, Episode 4

- Something that informs the way I see Thrawn:
 - o Thrawn says: "To defeat an enemy, you must know them."
 - o Sun Tzu, the author of *The Art of War* says: "To know your enemy, you must become your enemy."
 - o Thrawn says to Hera: "I study the art of war, work to perfect it."
 - o What did Thrawn do? He left the Chiss. He became a Grand Admiral in the Empire.

 - iv. More Imperial mindset exploration but through the eyes of an outsider with his own goals and motives. Pay attention to the details in this one; the details paint an interesting picture.
 - v. Realize what Thrawn tried to do with Nightswan, and have that shine a light on his interactions with Hera and Phoenix Squadron.
 - vi. Themes of subterfuge and manipulation by multiple parties.
 - vii. **Main characters realize the Empire is gathering a lot of resources.**

 - ii. Pay attention to the balance he tries to maintain.
 - iii. **Time Period: 2BBY**
 - a. **Episode 16 – Through Imperial Eyes**
 - iv. Extremely Important (**Remember this episode after reading Thrawn: Alliances**)

1. (Also remember this quote: Yularen- “I would never have suspected one of my best students was capable of this betrayal.” Thrawn- “And that is why you and so many others have been deceived.” I see a nuance of double meaning from Thrawn)
2. *Remember and consider what Kallus had to do to maintain his position in the Empire while acting as a Fulcrum agent.

b. Episode 20 – Zero Hour: Part 1

i. **OMG EXTREMELY IMPORTANT**

1. Realize that Thrawn knows the code phrase? Realize that Thrawn was jamming the very signal that later led him to the base.

i. *“You may have transmitted your warning, Agent, but in doing so, you’ve given me the last piece of the puzzle.”*

2. Remember that Thrawn is manipulating the Empire as well.
3. **Direct setup to Thrawn: Alliances**

c. Episode 21 – Zero Hour: Part 2

i. **OMG EXTREMELY IMPORTANT**

ii. **Remember what Thrawn tried to do with Nightswan in Thrawn.**

a. Pay attention to what Thrawn and The Bendu say to each other.

i. **“You cannot see...”** and then **Thrawn’s reaction is everything.**

- ii. **EXTREMELY IMPORTANT – WILL MAKE YOU RETHINK EVERYTHING**
- iii. *My favorite book*
- iv. Introduces echoes of another conflict.
- v. Introduces Batuu (Galaxy’s Edge, The Disney Theme Park in Cali and Florida)
 1. You can walk where Thrawn and [Redacted Character] walked!
- vi. **This will make you rethink everything Thrawn does and what he is capable of in both Thrawn and in Star Wars Rebels TV Show.**
 1. Make note of what Thrawn says to [redacted character] about why he knows where enemies are located.
 - a. (Ask me after you’ve read or recognize this part haha. I don’t want to spoil, but it specifically will make you rethink all of

Rebels TV Series, and why I think Thrawn was preparing an Operation Valkyrie type of thing behind the Empire's back.)

- vii. Explains a major part of Thrawn's true mission and what motivates him.
- viii. Gives new meaning to "For if one is remembered by a friend, one is never truly gone."
- ix. Makes me see "The Rise of Skywalker" title name differently (beautifully).

- i. Uses audiobook audio from Thrawn and Thrawn *Alliances* and scenes from Star Wars Rebels. My pinned comment connects some of what I see in connections that might be cool to consider.

- a. **Time Period: 2BBY (Takes place during *Rebels* Season 4, during the week when Tarkin called Thrawn back to Coruscant to argue for his Tie Defender project funding over Director Krennic's Death Star funding)**
- b. A great *Rogue One* addition, informing more about Director Krennic's mindset and Tarkin's amazing manipulations.
- c. Shows a glimpse at what Thrawn wants to protect.
- d. Shows a glimpse at Chiss society.
- e. **Realize what Thrawn had access to as a Grand Admiral of the Empire** (the palace's strategic planning center)
 - i. "If someone saw an interior that didn't match the exterior, the illusion would fall apart." -Pik (Deathtrooper) "So, you don't let anyone see it." – Ronan
- f. Remember when Thrawn, in the first *Thrawn Book*, lost perception of time and space for 10 minutes, and Eli had to go check on him, fearing something was wrong? **Pay attention to the Chiss navigators' symptoms in this book** and compare to this scene.
 - i. From *Thrawn Book 1*: "The other Chiss didn't understand. They never had. He'd been asked innumerable times how he was able to build such detailed tactical knowledge from such obscure and insignificant ingredients... To Thrawn, nothing in a species' art was obscure or insignificant. **All the threads tied together; all the brushstrokes spoke to him; all the light curves told the story of their creator.**"
 - ii. From Star Wars Rebels: Kanan tells Ezra to "listen to the stone and its story" when they were trying to open the temple on Lothal. Ezra uses the same technique to open the portal to the World Between Worlds.
 - iii. From *The Jedi Path*: "Moving meditation is an awake-state that reduces distraction and increases your focus on a task – you may find it improves your ability to repair a device, your skill in sifting through data in the Archives, or your

combat drills." I'm suspicious that Thrawn perhaps does this naturally or even involuntarily with art, architecture, etc...

- iv. From *Thrawn Book 1*: "**Distantly**, Thrawn became aware that a new image had entered the pattern of Umbaran art flowing around him. **Reluctantly**, he withdrew his mind from contemplation and reflection and **narrowed his focus**."
- v. This was tangent sorry haha. It's awesome to think back to Thrawn Book 1 after realizing some things in Alliances and Treason.
- g. Gives a new perspective of urgency and stress that Thrawn is under when Thrawn reappears at Lothal for the Rebels Series Finale.
 - i. *It is not only because of his Tie Defender program and squashing the Rebels...*
 - 1. *Realize that Thrawn suddenly has Imperial Guards on the ISD Chimaera in the Rebels finale... Who were they for?... (Not Ezra).*
 - 2. *Remember how Ezra was like, "Something in the Force is changing." And Ezra seems to have a greater purpose in the Rebels finale. "Whatever happens, happens to both of us."*

- i. Every episode is important 😊 but these four point out important things about Thrawn specifically.
 - a. **Episode 1 & 2 – Heroes of Mandalore**
 - i. **(This episode is set before Thrawn: Treason)**
 - ii. Recognize Thrawn's disgust at Fenn Rau, so much so that he had to turn his back away from the Mandalorian Traitor. Recognize that he delays Fenn Rau.
 - b. **Episode 15 & 16 – Family Reunion and Farewell**
 - i. **Set directly after Thrawn: Treason Epilogue**
 - 1. Quotes to Remember:
 - a. "He [Emperor Palpatine] commands only the loyalty of my actions, not the loyalty of my heart and mind. The deepest secrets of the Chiss will always remain secret." – Thrawn to Ar'alani
 - b. "I was pondering the problem of mixed loyalties, and the decisions one must sometimes make." – Thrawn to Faro
 - c. "If one is remembered by a friend, one is never truly gone." – Thrawn

- c. Introduces the conflicts of the Unknown Region and explains why they are so isolated from the rest of the galaxy.
- d. **Family** and what it means. What is lost in all but name.
- e. Che'ri, a "skywalker," says: "They didn't understand. None of them understood."
- f. Thrawn and Ar'alani – that's it, just them. They're the best.

 - i. Recall Vah'nya's description from *Thrawn: Treason*, and what Thrawn tells [Redacted Character] about them in *Thrawn: Alliances*.
 - 1. Not specific here to avoid spoilers; feel free to ask later!
- b. Informs so much about Chiss society
- c. Connection with The Last Jedi
 - i. Snoke uses the same navigators that [greater evil villain] uses (purple robes).

 - ii. This is the only "legend" story I've personally read. Star Wars Rebels introduced me to Thrawn.
