Megara	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trades • A member of a league • Near some type of body of water. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Neighbors of Corinth • Boys were only allowed to go to school at age 7-14 • Did trading with Corinth • Got coinage from Corinth • A member of the Peloponnesian League but aligned with the Athens.
Corinth	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trades • A member of a league • Near some type of body of water 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A monarchy • Many people were unemployed • People who were unemployed joined a public works program that the government created. • Create own type of coinage • Boys were only allowed to go to

Sparta	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trades • A member of a league • Near some type of body of water 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Does not want to be in war. • Does not do a lot of trade • Does not force people into paying to be in their alliance. • Oppose to democracy • Tries to keep their own territory. • The leader to the Peloponnesian League
