University makes a big deal about the value of interdisciplinarity. Department makes trouble for T&P candidates of color with regard to interdisciplinarity (that's not sociology! That's political science!)...but not with whites (like me, who publishes in performance studies and cultural studies journals in addition to sociology and had no problem in the T&P process).
