#### **PRAYING THE TEXTS**

In response to the texts for the day you are invited to find a way to pray the texts that feels right for you. You may engage as many of these as you like, feeling free to explore what you find most meaningful.

- Silently meditate at your seat. Perhaps find one phrase or image from the text and dwell with that in your mind. If you aren't sure how to start, begin by focusing on your breath.
- Pray by listening or singing along with the music [you can find the words at ELW # ]
- Take a walk around the worship space or even take a moment outside. Move your body in whatever way helps you reflect on the texts
- Sit at the table provided to write a response. You can journal, write poetry, free-write, note prayers that come to mind, or write a response to someone in the texts.
- Sit at the table provided to create a visual response to the texts, representing in your own way a scene, idea, theme, or image from the text.
- Light candles at the prayer station and/or write your prayers on the prayer wall provided. Take time to pray through what others have written.

for all who strive to save the earth from carelessness and destruction . . .


for the church of Jesus Christ in every land . . .
