Man charged in chase that killed his twin

A west side man has been charged with killing his twin brother last month after a police chase ended in a rollover crash.

Anthony Quinn Gill attracted the attention of officers when his car sped through a residential area going as fast as 50 mph with the stereo blaring, according to a criminal complaint.

As officers pursued the fleeing Buick on July 29, according to the complaint, it roared into the intersection at N. 18th St. and W. North Ave. without stopping for a stop sign and slammed into a trailer being pulled by a truck before overturning.

Gregory A. Gill, 22, was ejected through the front passenger window and was found by officers lying in the street bleeding. As police rushed to help him, the complaint says, his brother climbed out the driver's window and fled on foot.

After being taken into custody, according to the complaint, Gill, 22, of the 3900 block of W. Cherry St., blamed the crash on police because they were chasing him.

His brother was taken to Froedtert Memorial Lutheran Hospital in Wauwatosa, where he died the next day from brain injuries.

The complaint says a bag containing 50 rocks of crack cocaine was found near the overturned car.

The surviving brother is scheduled to have a preliminary hearing next week on the felony charge of fleeing resulting in death, which carries a prison term of as long as five years.
