**Twain info of the Day:** Samuel Langhorne Clemens known by his pen name Mark Twain, was an American writer, humorist, entrepreneur, publisher, and lecturer. He was lauded as the "greatest humorist the United States has produced",<sup>[2]</sup> and William Faulkner called him "the father of American literature".<sup>[3]</sup> His novels include *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* (1876) and its sequel, *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*.

**Bonus Twain fact of the Day:** Twain named his fictional character, Tom Sawyer, after a San Francisco fireman whom he met in June 1863. The real Tom Sawyer was a local hero, famous for rescuing 90 passengers after a shipwreck. The two remained friendly during Twain's three-year stay in San Francisco, often drinking and gambling together.
