As a reminder, there is no school this Monday, January 17th in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

In ELA this week, we continued reading Hoot. We have been discussing setting, point of view, problem/solution, figurative language and characters through the novel. In math, we continued with multiplying fractions by fractions using both models and the standard algorithm. We also worked on finding the area of rectangles with fractional dimensions, and began multiplying with mixed numbers. During our unit of inquiry time, students answered the questions of: What do plants eat? Where do fallen leaves go? Do worms really eat dirt? These explorations helped students explore and critically think about what needs to be added to their biodomes to create a self-sustaining ecosystem. Students should be thinking about what materials and supplies they can bring in from home to create their biospheres.
