Background report for Annual Parish Council meeting May 2016

50.16 Election of Chairman

63.16 Reports

- b. Flood Action Group Cllr Mariner, the Clerk and the Flood warden attended the most recent Wiltshire Council Flood Ops group meeting in April. There is very little to report, other than the costing Flood amelioration Scheme still hadn't been sent to Ringway for costing, but this would probably be done in May. Both Danny Everett, the Drainage Engineer & Wilts Cllr Mike Hewitt would like to wait until the full costings have been done before coming to give a presentation to the Parish Council and Pitton village residents, as if the scheme proves too expensive, some other solution will need to be found. The next Flood Ops Group meeting is on Wednesday 15th June at Chitterne Village Hall.
- c. Pitton Village Hall Management Committee the Working Group looking at the future offering of the Hall had undertaken a village survey, collated the results, and had reported to the management Committee. The Committee agreed to explore the installation of wi-fi, but felt that the number of responses received were insufficient to justify any action, and that further consultation will be needed. It was thought that the Working Group could run a stall at the Pitton Carnival to do this, and the Working Group will meet again to discuss this further.

f. Parish Clerk's report -

- I have attended the Highways briefing, Flood Group and Area Board meetings in the last month. I've had a number of reports about fly tipping, in Ben Lane Farley, at the Coronation Field in Farley, in Bentley Wood in Farley and along the byway/Clarendon Way in Pitton leading off The Green, and also from the track leading upto Badgers Rest. I have reported them all to Wiltshire Council, and I'm aware that the tyres in Ben Lane have been removed.
- Please note that the annual approval of the accounts and completion of the Governance Statement will be on the next agenda.
- Please note that Wiltshire Council has confirmed that the Parish Council is now able to co-opt to fill the Pitton ward vacancy. At the time of writing, I am not aware of anyone who has expressed an interest in joining the Council.
- Please note I have advised Wiltshire Council of the Farley ward vacancy. The appropriate notice will be displayed shortly.
- g. Southern Area Board the next meeting will take place on Thursday 26th May at 6.45pm at Trafalgar School, Downton.

64.16 Finance

d. Clerk's attendance at the SLCC South Region roadshow at Yeovil – this will cost the same as last year, ie £69.00 plus VAT, but shared 50:50 with Wilton TC. Topics covered will include current issues regarding financial administration, VAT, law, risk assessments, devolution of assets and services and the protection of the historic environment.

Please also note that I have requested a refund of £120 from Eon in respect of the payments for the electricity supply to the Pitton pump control, and the monthly payment has been reduced from £27.00 to £10.00 as from 1st June.

65.15 Highway/Parish Steward/Footpath matters

a. Highways/Parish Steward briefing meeting - The new contractor, Ringway, is now in place, and is starting to deliver. Wilts Council continues to retreat to delivering just its statutory responsibilities. However, the Parish Steward scheme is a discretionary service, which has been reintroduced, as it was effective and popular in the past. However, it will be reviewed in a year's time, and the service will be reduced to parishes which don't use it, and the resources redeployed to those that do. All Streetscene/pothole issues need to be reported via the My Wilts app, and the parish/town councils have the opportunity to prioritise upto five issues each month that need attention. A list of tasks will be circulated shortly. Anyone can report issues via the app - go here: http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/report.htm to download the app to your smartphone or ipad, or to download to your laptop. There will be more comprehensive and detailed information circulated with the next Highways newsletter, which I will circulate as usual.

Longer term, the Parish Council may wish to consider providing a "top up" road cleaning and gully emptying service, especially in the flood prone areas of the parish. The Parish Council may be able to assume the General Power of Competence next May, after the elections, as hopefully all seats will be filled at the election, which will satisfy part of the eligibility criteria, which will give it the legal power to deliver this, if it wishes.

b. Footpath maintenance issues – Brian Cudby & Nigel Welsh of the local Ramblers Association asked the Riverbourne Community Centre in Laverstock to visit and make suggestions as to how the problem of Footpath 27 could be made safer as it drops down the Pitton escarpment to meet The Green. Unfortunately, it seems that it will be more difficult and more expensive than first thought, and we are waiting for nick Cowen, the RoW officer to give his thoughts.

67.16 Ongoing matters

- a. Development of an Emergency Plan there seems little appetite to develop this, and so I recommend it is put into abeyance for the time being.
- b. Registering title no further news. I will press the solicitor on this.

- c. Purchase of a toddler swing I have not yet received confirmation that the R2 funding can be made available. The Wiltshire Council officer dealing with this retired at the end of March, and has not yet been replaced, but I will press for a reply. The existing swing has been removed.
- d. Litter picking I have been approached by Mrs Sankey with the possibility of organising a litter pick through the church organisations. The Parish Council can provide the insurance cover, and via the Area Board, can also provide litter picking equipment. Wiltshire Council will collect the litter, suitably bagged, at no charge. But eth parish Council may like to buy its own in due course. The idea is to organise a community event to pick up as much litter as possible, and then for individuals to take responsibility for their own small areas, to keep on top of it. I will continue to liaise with Mrs Sankey.
