OSHKOSH FLYER GIVEN PROMOTION TO CAPTAIN

Gaylord W. Schultz, son of O. H. Schultz of 2213 Doty street, Oshkosh, has been promoted to captain at the Lubbock army flying school at Lubbock, Tex., according to Col. Thomas L. Gilbert, commanding officer.

Captain Schultz is a graduate of the Oshkosh High school and attended the University of Wisconsin for two years, then the U. S. military academy. During his university days he participated in football, crew and the pistol team, being awarded letters.

Captain Schultz was transferred from Brooks Field, Tex., to the large Lubbock twin-engine school, where the air corps is training heavyweight aviation cadets to fly its big bombers and transport planes.

From 1936 to 1941 Captain Schultz was a sales engineer for the General Electric Company. Prior to serving at Brooks Field and Lubbock, he served at Camp Custer and Fort Snelling.

Mrs. Schultz is the former Lorraine A. Thomas of Oshkosh. They have one child, Thomas Gaylord, who is 18 months old.

First Lieut. Gaylord W. Schultz, formerly of Oshkosh, has just been transferred from Brooks Field, Texas, to the army air corps advanced flying school, newly completed at Lubbock, Tex. He is among the first officers going to one of the newest fields built under the air corps' speeded-up victory expansion program. The field is a twin-engine flying school.

Lieutenant Schultz is commanding officer of the 502nd school squadron. He is the son of O. H. Schultz, 2213 Doty street, Oshkosh.

Gaylord Schultz, appointee to the national military academy at West Point, N. Y., left Oshkosh this morning to enroll July 1 at the school. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. O. H. Schultz, 2313 Doty street.

Major Schultz has been discharged from the army air forces after four years of service including duty as commandant of cadets in an AAF bombardier school in Big Springs, Tex. While at the school he was responsible for the officer training of American, French, Brazilian and Chinese cadets. The former army officer is the son of Mr. and Mrs. O. H. Schultz, 2213 Doty street.
