1. Welcome and Introductions

2. Spartan Run Committee Update – Over \$24,000 was raised! It was a do it yourself event at the middle school. Great community event. Plan is to wait for the Spring to host another event. In the future we will plan to move it to the Fall. Significant planning involved and the help of many volunteers.

3. Treasurer Report – Jamie Wallace handed out a report containing all of the expenses, income, starting budget. Biggest expense to date is the staff's welcome back breakfast. We are starting off the year comfortable because of the Spartan Run and therefore we don't have to do much fundraising. We will not ask for jump start donations but will plan to still do the dining for dollars.

4. Fundraising – Calareso's - Joe Joffe and Erin Kennedy have volunteered for this. We will sell gift certificates in the Fall and Spring. \$10 certificates and 25% comes back to our PTO. Certificates never expire and can be used on anything. We will accept cash or check, but not Venmo.
