

1993 NBA All-Star Game



The 1993 NBA All-Star Game took place on February 21, 1993, and was an exhibition game played between the Eastern Conference and the Western Conference at the Delta Center in Salt Lake City, home of the Utah Jazz. This was the 43rd edition National Basketball Association all-star game played during the 1992-1993 season. The Western Conference went on to beat the East 135 to 132 in overtime. Playing on their home court, Karl Malone and John Stockton shared the game's MVP award. The game was played in front of a crowd of 19,459 as Dick Enberg, Mike Fratello, and Magic Johnson announced the game for NBC. Boyz II Men performed the National Anthem.

The coaches for the 1993 NBA All-Star Game were chosen for the best current season win percentage in their conference through the games of February 18, 1993. The head coach for the Eastern Conference was Pat Riley, head coach of the New York Knicks for the regular season, and his 9th NBA All-Star appearance as a head coach. The head coach for the Western Conference was Paul Westphal, first year as head coach of the Phoenix Suns for the regular season.

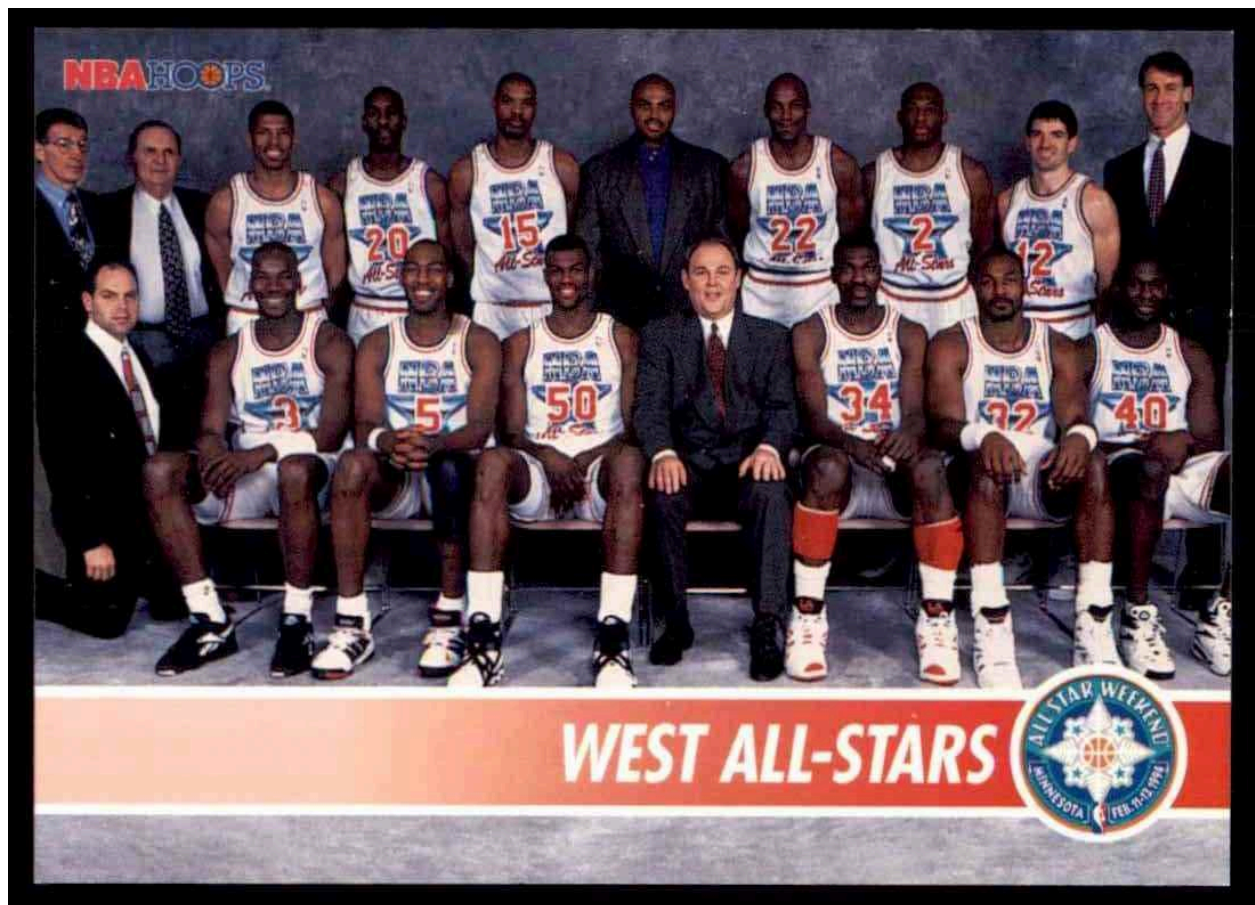
The 1993 NBA All-Star game would be a highlight for many NBA players. This would be Michael Jordan's last NBA All-Star game before leaving the NBA for the first time, although he would return to play in five more. For Isiah Thomas, this would be his last NBA All-Star appearance; meanwhile, this would also be the All-Star debut of Shaquille O'Neal, and the first time the Orlando Magic and Charlotte Hornets franchises ever had a player in the NBA All-Star Game. The starters for the Eastern Conference included: Michael Jordan as shooting guard, Isiah Thomas as point guard, Scottie Pippen as small forward, Larry Johnson as power forward, and Shaquille O'Neal as center. The starters for the Western Conference included: Clyde Drexler as shooting guard, John Stockton as point guard Charles Barkley as small forward, Karl Malone as Power forward, and David Robinson as Center. All starters would end up in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame except for Larry Johnson. Mitch Richmond on Western Conference was injured and replaced by Terry Porter. Chris Mullin on the Western Conference team was also injured; however, he was not replaced by anyone.

1993 NBA All-Star Game Recap

Hometown favorites and pick-and-roll partners John Stockton and Karl Malone paced the West squad to an overtime win, with Malone scoring 28 points and Stockton, the NBA's all-time assist leader, racking up 15 assists. The game marked the passing of the torch, in many respects.

Michael Jordan, who scored a game-high 30 points, played in his last All-Star Game before leaving the NBA for the first time (though he would eventually play in five more). Isiah Thomas, a 12-time All-Star, played in his last All-Star Game. A starter in his finale, Thomas had eight points and four assists in 32 minutes.

A big rookie from LSU, Orlando's Shaquille O'Neal, played in the first of his 12 games. In his 18-year career, Shaq would be selected to 15 games and earn All-Star MVP three times. Charlotte forward Larry Johnson became the first All-Star for the Hornets' franchise, scoring four points. The MVP of the 1992-93 season, Charles Barkley, made his debut on the West All-Star team as a member of the Suns after six seasons as an East All-Star. He finished with 16 points and seven rebounds. At All-Star weekend, Cavs guard Mark Price won the first of his back-to-back 3-Point Contest titles. Heat rookie Harold Miner, dubbed by some as "Baby Jordan," took home his first of two career Slam Dunk Contest titles.





1993X: "NBA, I Love This Game" All-Star Game



The East defeated the West 96 – 84 with Michael Jordan of the Indiana Pacers taking home the Most Valuable Player Award. Jordan scored 18 points, pulled down 7 rebounds, dished out 6 assists, and added 2 steals and blocked shots, respectively. David Robinson of the Cleveland Cavaliers followed up with 11 points, 6 rebounds, 3 blocked shots, and 2 steals in the win.

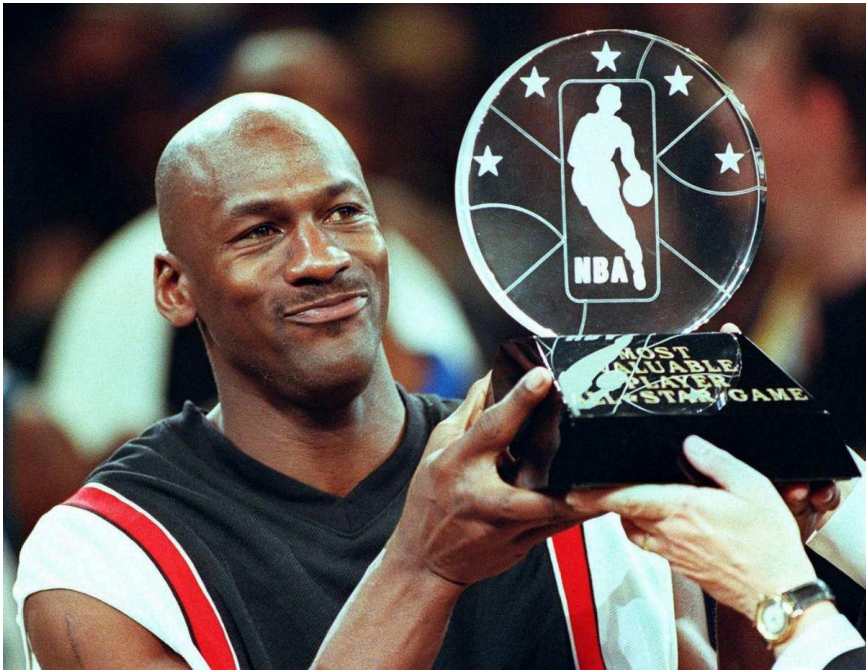
Karl Malone of the Houston Rockets led the West with 12 points, 15 rebounds, and added 2 assists. Patrick Ewing of the Los Angeles Lakers contributed 14 points, grabbed 9 rebounds, and added 3 blocked shots in the loss.

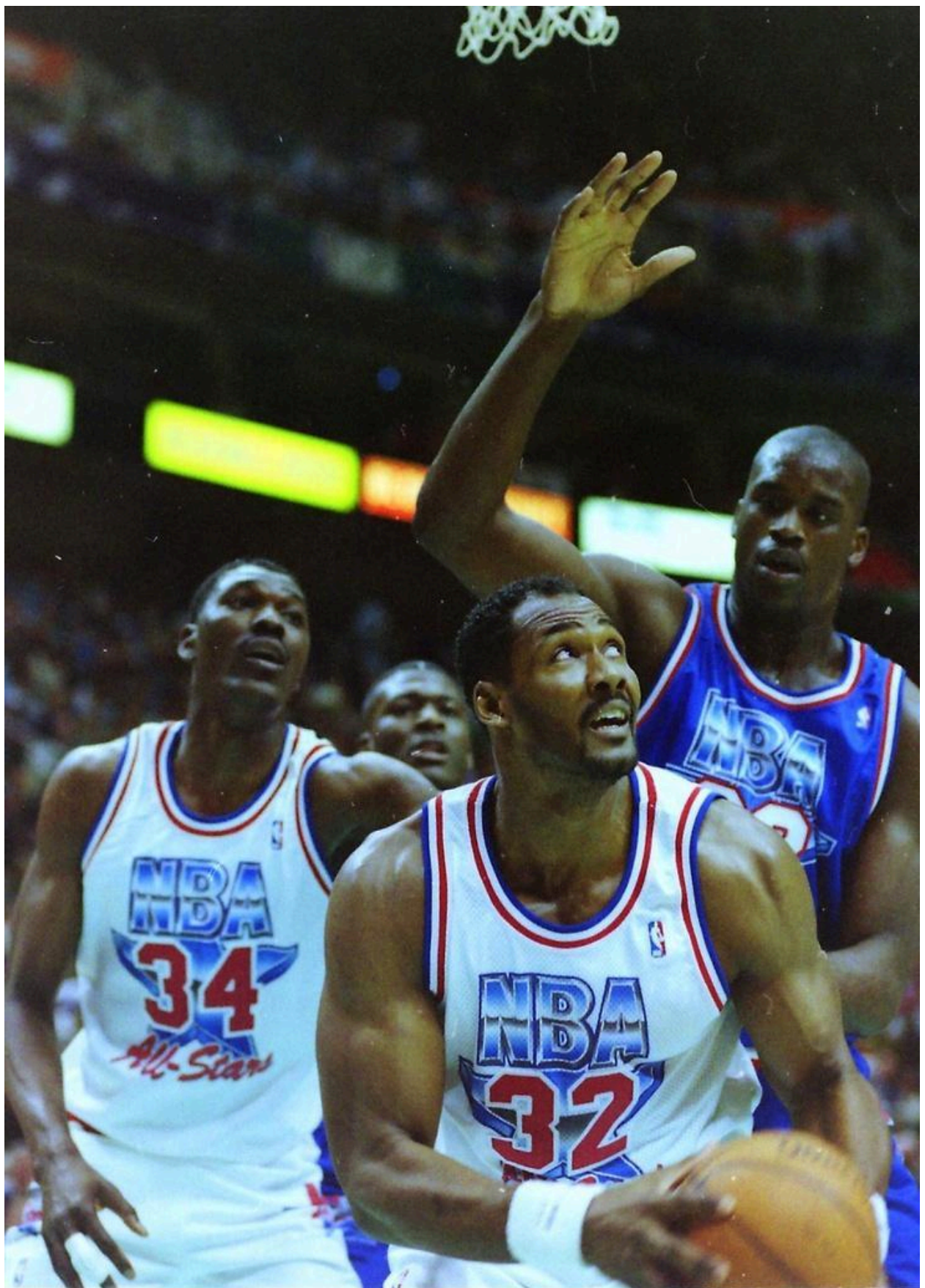

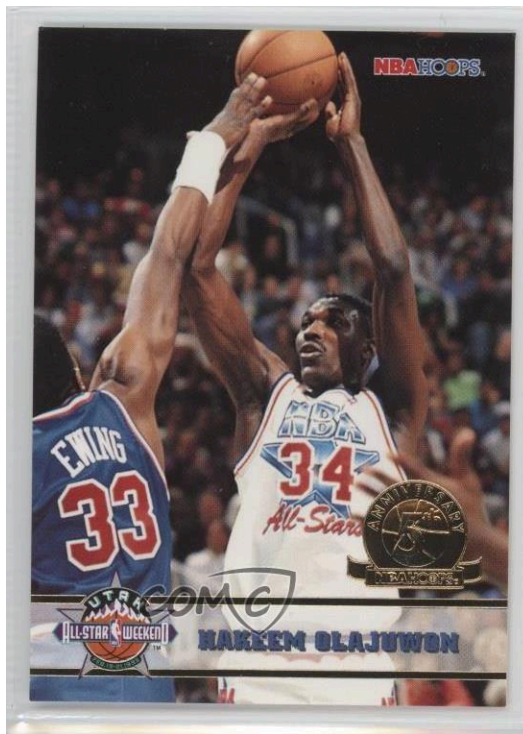

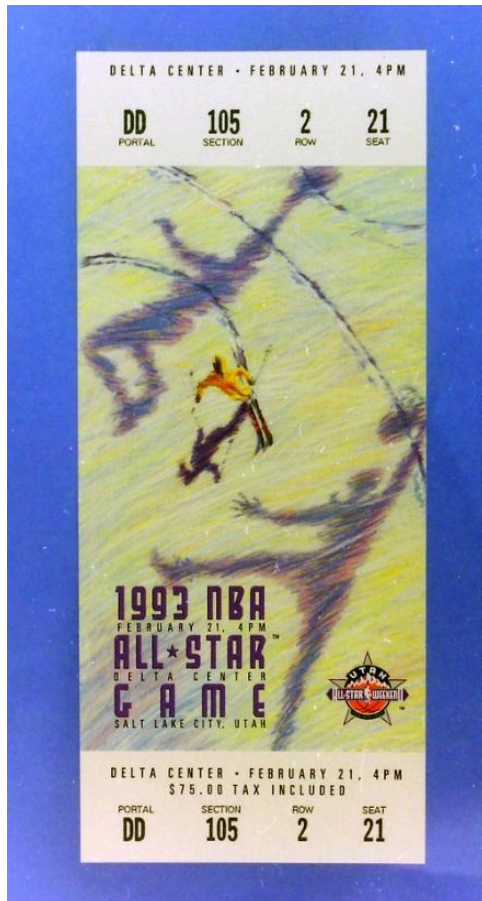
