

Student-Use Protocol for the Ethical Use of AI Tools

DEFINITION

As a student, ethical use of AI Tools implies...

1	I understand how the tool works, including its capabilities and limitations.	
Ζ	I understand the terms, conditions, and privacy policies associated with the tool.	
3	 I use the AI tool to enhance my learning and creativity, not to replace it: I do the high-order thinking and let the AI tool replace lower-order thinking or tasks, I use the AI tool for rote or procedural, not conceptual skills, I use the AI tools when they are appropriate (see above) and not as a means to complete work at the last minute. 	
4	 I use the AI tool only when it has been explicitly allowed by the instructor, and do not assume that it is permitted in all contexts: When I am unsure if AI tool use is permitted, I seek clarification from my instructors. 	
5	 I treat Al output as a secondary source of information that is not always accurate and take steps to critically evaluate its output: I attribute ideas and products to their original author or source, I vet all Al output by doing an external search for the original author or source, I check all Al output for accuracy against external sources. 	



6	 I reflect on my use of the AI tool throughout the process: I seek to understand how it enhanced my learning, I seek to understand how it limited my learning. 	
7	 I am transparent about where, how, and why I used the tool: I cite the tool in my work, I explain how I used the tool in my work. 	

QUESTIONS

To be an ethical user of AI tools, I must ask the following questions...

Before		
1	How am I going to use the tool? (To replace or enhance?)	
Z	Have I been given permission to use the tool in that context?	
3	Is my intention to learn or to just get a grade?	
4	Do I know how to use the tool?	
5	Do I understand the strengths and limitations of the tool?	
During		
1	Is the output biased?	
Z	Is the output accurate (or is it hallucinating)?	
3	Is there a better prompt? Can I ask a different or better question?	

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4	Are there other ways to do this WITHOUT AI tools?	
5	Am I acquiring the learning objectives of the course or assignment by using the AI tool?	
6	Where did the output come from (source, authorship)?	
7	Are the printed sources accurate?	
8	Have I vetted alternative perspectives?	
9	Am I using the tool appropriately according to our definition of ethical use of AI tools?	
After		
1	Are my original ideas present in my work?	
2	Am I spreading misinformation or perpetuating harmful ideas, biases, etc.?	
3	How did I use the tool?	
4	How did it affect my learning?	
5	How did this assignment (and use of AI tools) help me advance my understanding of the content or learning objectives?	
б	Have I been transparent about my use of AI tools?	
7	Have I cited original authors and sources appropriately?	
8	Have I cited my use of the AI tool appropriately?	
9	Have I plagiarized (knowingly or unknowingly)?	

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
