Attendance

Regular school attendance is fundamental to a child's academic success and development.

We recognise being ill may prevent your child from coming to school, but sneezes, seasonal coughs and headaches, without a temperature are not a reason to miss school. Over the counter medicines can be given before school and we will contact you if your child becomes too ill to remain in school. Feeling tired is not an illness and will be coded as an unauthorised absence.

If your child has diarrhoea or vomiting, they should not return to school until 48 hours after the last episode or symptom. If you are unsure how long your child should be absent with an illness please visit the NHS website below for advice

Road Works in our area

Please be advised that West Sussex County Council has received a request for Temporary Traffic lights on Bost Hill. There will be a daytime road closure between A27 Arundel Road and Findon Road for safety works to the verge side of the slope. This will come into effect from Wednesday 17th January-Friday 26th January between the times of 9:30am - 3pm. This may affect traffic and congestion at drop off/ pick up times. Please can we ask you to allow extra time when dropping in and collecting your children. Thank you.
