- Rachel Wilson
  - Exposed gas pipe at Old Creek and the Beach is decommissioned and should be removed. It is an attractive nuisance and can potentially block Old Creek causing a buildup of debris in the creek.
- Carol Kramer
  - Third Street and Pacific public access has a lot of foliage plus couches. It needs to be cleaned out. It has a walk-out lookout.
  - We could not see anyone needing help at that access-dangerous situation
- Sue Black—what is the county doing about our county creeks? Flooding caused by overgrowth
  - Greg Bettencourt

     –there was a site visit re: Little Cayucos Creek; It is the property owners responsibility to clean the creek
    - Must have a permit to do most creek cleaning
    - Kate Valentine from the County met with Greg Bettencourt and Bruce Gibson and walked the creek. She explained what you can do.

- Can remove dead fall that blocks the creek and trim limbs that might block the creek.
- Can remove invasive plants.
- Sue Black-Worried that owners are not cleaning the creek bed.

  - 2004–John wrote up a flier on Norma Rose Park as the soon to be built park
  - Norma Rose Park will be on the agenda for our April Meeting

# SLOCOG Transportation Documents LRF Presentation-3.6.24

- Potential transportation tax for November 2024
  - Self Help Tax
    - 25 Counties have a dedicated sales tax for transportation including our neighboring taxes
    - SLO County does not have a dedicated tax
      - Could be worth \$35 million per year
      - Leverage the funds for more funds from the state—more money you put in, the more you get
      - Tax would be kept in the county to spend
      - Project delivery would be more efficient
      - Guarantee the tax would go to transportation

- 1% maximum for administrative fees
- SLOCOG is the regional governing board for transportation
  - 12 Board of Directors
    - Bruce Gibson represents us
- Most money comes from the gas tax
- SLOCOG did the Estero Bluffs Easement
- Produce the Regional Transportation Plan
  - Calculate funding needs
  - Approved in June 2023
    - 5.4 Billion Needed
    - 2.3 Billion Deficit
- Main Issue:
  - Lack of gas tax
  - Fewer gallons of gas due to EV's (25% of all new sales) and better vehicle efficiency
- SLOCOG needs new funding opportunity
  - Misconceptions
    - Gas tax does not have enough funding to fix our roads
    - State will not reprioritize funds to our roads
    - Local funding may or may not be reprioritized
    - CalTrans has only funded 2 major improvements on 101 in the last 25 years
    - The state will change something that will fix everything
- Local Road Maintenance
  - County roads are decreasing in maintenance
  - o The more roads deteriorate, the more expensive they become to fix
  - More funding will decrease the cost overall because they can be fixed before they deteriorate too much
- SLOCOG received \$50 million for Cuesta Grade (25 years ago)
- SLOCOG received money for Shell Beach (2023)
- No money for North County
- Rent, Medical, and Groceries will not be taxed.
- \$60,000 per year salary it would cost \$2.31 per week in extra taxes
- Draft Investment Plan-February 7, 2024
  - Measure J in 2016 did not pass
  - Broke the county into 4 regions
  - Split the county based on population
- Cavucos will receive about \$4 million
  - Road repairs, safety improvements, downtown improvements
  - Additional \$11 million for unincorporated areas
- May 1st will approve or deny the final investment plan
- May 29th will determine whether or not to put it on the ballot
- Jim Dantona
  - State looks to see how much locals can put into a project. The more you put into a project, the more the state will give you.
  - We are losing out to other counties, because we can compete with our local match

- Road quality in Morro Bay has dropped from a 63 to a 48 in quality
- Paul Choucalas
  - Not getting a lot of money for Cayucos
  - Cayucos just gets a sliver even though we have a lot of tourists since we have a small population
  - Concern about adding another tax to people on fixed incomes
    - John DiNunzio with SLOCOG
      - Atascadero, Paso Robles and Morro Bay have their own funding
      - 46 West is being redesigned at 101
- John Carsel
  - Need a right hand turn lane from Highway 1 onto Ocean and Shearer Avenue
- Greg Bettencourt
  - What does downtown improvements mean?
    - Annie Bowsky
      - Tell Bruce Gibson what we want for road improvements in our county
- Rachel Wilson
  - Need repairs on Ocean Avenue at the bridge near Old Creek
  - Need repairs on Lucerne
- Rachel Wilson
  - Concerned that the road on Hacienda is being damaged when the water pipes are being replaced and that the repair to the road is not adequate
  - Blake Fixler–Contact Public Works

# Supervisor Report: Blake Fixler (Bruce Gibson is in Sacramento)

- Norma Rose Park Update
  - 2007 a master plan was completed for Norma Rose

- Grading plans prepared 2012
- Construction of restrooms
- Footprint of the park is vested
- Temporary dog park will be relocated when the other features show up
- Hold-Up
  - Construction funding
  - Long-term maintenance funding
- Playground Estimate
  - **\$700,000**
- Pier Update
  - Pilings fell off of the end of the pier
  - More thorough inspection before it opens entirely
  - Greg Bettencourt on Pier Warranty
    - Talked to Shawn Cooper
      - Cursory walk with Bruce Elster
      - Speculate that one of the really large stumps from the creek near Hardy Park banged up against the farthest right hand side pilings
        - Weakened the pilings
        - Week later—the high surf broke the pilings loose
      - One loose piling caused several to be loose
      - At least 5 pilings are missing
      - Company out of San Diego hired to determine cause
        - Inspection of pier and on the engineering on the rebuild to see if it is faulty
        - Will send divers down
        - Probably in May
        - Report in June
        - July, August–hopefully get a waiver from the Coastal Commission
        - Hopefully fixed before Winter
        - Money–collected more money than we needed in the previous drive
          - County can use this money to repair (interest not principal)
            - \$120,000 in interest over the last 10 years that can be spent
        - Inspection and Engineering Report and Plans will take the \$120,000
        - Ask for money from the Coastal Conservancy
- SoCal Gas Pipe
  - Did not remove due to required environmental permitting
  - Working on permit
- Vets Hall
- The contractor is a few months behind schedule
- Completion: Late July or Early August
- Should get it at the price we were supposed to

- Potholes—did not include general surfacing of the parking lot
  - Public works will work on the parking lot
- Friday, April 26th Training for Advisory Council Members
  - o 8:30 to Noon
  - San Luis Obispo Library
  - Last training was 2019
- Supervisors March Items
  - Update on making affordable housing for enticing (March 12th)
  - Redistricting (March 26th)
- Paul Choucalas
  - Wood Shake Roof is a 7 Year Roof
  - Greg Bettencourt
    - Roof on the Vets Hall is wood shingle because that was the original roof
    - Blake Fixler
      - Is required as part of the grant due to historical nature
  - New shake roofs are from tree-farms so the shingles are not as weak
