Additionally, the education and ministry major focuses on preparing students for roles in Christian schools, churches, and faith-based educational programs.

Graduates will be equipped to serve as biblical educators, church leaders, and theological scholars, capable of training and mentoring future generations in faith and ministry. The program emphasizes research, critical thinking, and applied leadership, making it an excellent choice for those who seek to teach or lead in faith-based communities and institutions.

Admissions Requirements

- Bachelor's degree in biblical studies, theology, education, or a related field
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- Two letters of recommendation from faculty, clergy, or professional mentors
- Statement of purpose outlining the student's interest in biblical scholarship and education
- Interview with faculty admissions committee

Practicum Requirement

Students must complete a 300-hour supervised practicum in a faith-based educational institution, church, or Christian school.

This practicum provides hands-on experience in teaching, curriculum development, and ministry leadership, allowing students to apply their knowledge in real-world educational settings.

Master's Thesis

A master's thesis is required, focusing on biblical studies, religious education, or ministry leadership.

The thesis should be between 60-100 pages, follow APA or Turabian formatting, and demonstrate original research in biblical interpretation, theological education, or pastoral ministry.
