CAMPING CHECKLIST (2 Nights/ 3 Days)

Scouts should pack their own gear. It is advisable that adults check it against the list... but the scouts should select and put the gear into the bag.

Clothing

- Class A Uniform
- Class B T-shirt or other short sleeve shirts (1-2)
- Long sleeve shirts (1-2) based on weather
- Shorts/Pants (2)
- Long John's (1) We sleep in these in cool weather
- Sweatshirt (spare)
- Synthetic underwear (3)
- Bra's (1-2)
- Socks: Consider Wool or Wool/blend Socks for cooler weather. (2 to come in contact with your skin... 2 more that can be re-worn & used to layer)
- Spare closed-toe shoes

- Extra batteries

- A Snack (preferably with Protein in it)
- Pen/ Pencil

Personal Hygiene

- Toothbrush/paste
- Deodorant (please)
- Glasses, contacts case/solution
- Soap, Shampoo, Conditioner
- Feminine Products
- Sun Protection
- Insect Spray

OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Winter Hat (for sleeping)
- Lite pair of gloves
- Glowsticks (1/night)
- Towel(s) for shower/ swimming
- [Cot](#)/air mattress
- Gloves (2)
- Water-resistant coat
- [Balaclava](#)
- Hot hands
- Sleeping bag liner
- Pillow sack **or** small pillow **or** stuffed animal that can be used as a pillow. ~ 1/3 the size of a standard pillow or use your filled stuff sack

DON'T BRING

- Mess kits
- Technology is ok for car rides but must stay in cars including phones
- Any kind of in tent heaters
- LED Lanterns/Flashlights

1. **We recommend putting all clothing in Stuff sacks that are weather resistant inside a large duffle or backpack. Most Campers use 2 sets of stuff sacks.**
2. **All items should be in some kind of rugged Bag/ Stuff sack. Please no loose sleeping bags, pillows or trash bag luggage. You can get a larger stuff sack for these. We don't want to confuse belongings with garbage or things end up in the dirt!**
3. **Label all items. All gear & clothing looks the same.**
