- PTA funding can be used for many many positions- we are asking to hold off
- Hiring guide re: Coaches being district assigned v. coming out of site discretionary funding
- SPEC CAC- need to build a system of Multi Tiered System of Support...lots of eggs in the Tier 1 basket- need to build up Tier 2 & Tier 3
 - Coaches do not work directly with students who need additional support
 - Ask is to allow some flexibility in their job description- please don't decimate whatever Tier 2 interventions we have
 - o MTSS as a 3 legged stool- if one stool wobbly, the stool doesn't work
- NURSE- crucial for our MS
- Number of students at my school with IEPs- need a strategic reading intervention program
- Facilities- millions of dollars, looks like a \$10 paint job; things don't get fixed- need Quality Control across schools and things looking clean
- MS block scheduling- 90 min of PE on TH/FRI...MS Assistant Supe to re engineer the schedule so kids can get ample intervention time
 - Yes, we need to audit (continue to audit) our instructional minutes- Data team and C&I team need to work in alignment
 - Quality Control- best flesh out the role of the County Office of Education
- At my school, we are struggling so much with the keep the lights on staffing...examples of teachers out of my child's school for variety of reasons- appreciate the bare minimum for each school-callout to the lit coach and the para
 - Concerns re: the timing of things
 - We usually set our goals and then submit our budget
- Overall funding went down for focal students
- Pink slips
 - SERP- well received, 352? Applicants...which will help us in position identification...going through to offset the layoffs with the SERP
 - Take as many people off the list as possible
 - We will share soon how many people we
