## Sample Plan to meet Child Life Specialist Requirements

If you want to qualify as a Child Life Specialist, you will need to complete 10 child development courses required for Child Life Specialist certification. Once your courses have been completed, you will need to complete a Child Life Internship and pass the Child Life Certification exam. The ECS Department does not currently provide an internship opportunity, nor does SSU host the exam. However, your advisor can provide additional information about how to complete these requirements, or you can visit the website of the <u>Association of Child Life Specialists</u>.

Year 4	EDEC 460 Introduction to Research in Early Childhood Studies (4)

Year 2	EDEC 220 Child Observation with Field Experience* (4)
Year 3 or 4	EDEC 450 Empowerment and Equity for Children and Families (3) EDSP 432 Young Children with Special Needs (4)
