# 2025 READING MARATHON KICK-OFF WEEK DOOR DECORATING CONTEST

Attention teachers, parent volunteers, and students:

Take an active part in helping us get our colibríes excited about reading by creating some amazing door art!

PTA brings you the "Door Decorating Contest" as part of our "Reading Marathon" fundraising/reading challenge event. Below are some key dates and details to keep in mind when entering the contest:

- Theme/Book selection must be completed by teachers by **Jan 24 th**.
- Each grade PCs can begin requesting for volunteers **starting Jan 22 nd**. Each class must have a decorated door in order to be part of the contest.
- Volunteers can start decorating classroom doors <u>starting Thursday Feb. 6th</u>. Teachers/volunteers are encouraged to start designing, thinking about ideas, etc., but door decoration should start on or after <u>Feb 6th</u>.
- Door <u>must be completed by morning of Thursday</u>, <u>FEB 13th</u> in order for it to be considered for judging. Winners will be announced by the end of the day on Thursday 2/13 and a date when prizes will be awarded is to be set by the teachers.
- Decorations must be done on the inside of the door to prevent weather damage.
- Prizes includes one of the following: Pizza party, movie and popcorn party...(Class can select the prize)

#### DOOR DECORATING CONTEST CRITERIA

- **Visual impact:** This includes how visually appealing the design/decorations are. What are the first thought(s), impression(s) when you see the door?.
- **Craftsmanship:** How well constructed/decorated is the door. This includes cleanliness, neatness, relationship and cohesiveness between design elements.
- **Completeness:** Was the entire door space used? Is the design visible enough? Is there too much empty space that could have been decorated with other book/story elements not present in the book cover?)
- **Creativity:** Use of materials to give depth to the space, color, texture, etc.
- **Originality:** Was the sustainability of the materials used to decorate the door taken into consideration? Are the materials used recycled such as recycled cardboard, egg cartons, jar lids, etc.?

## DOOR JUDGING

- -Judging will take place on the morning of 2/13, and the winners will be announced via PS to our school community by the end of the day.
- -The maximum achievable total score per door is 20 points. The minimum achievable total score per door is 5 points.
- -Judges are to use the door decorating judging rubric to individually score each door based on the 5 different criteria categories of visual impact, craftsmanship, completeness, creativity, and originality. The door that has the highest total average in each grade group will win the prize.
- -If there are 2 or more doors with an equal highest average, judges will be asked to take a vote to select the top 3 doors. If a winner cannot be established after voting, the judges can declare a draw on the 2 top doors.

In order to keep the door judging as unbiased and transparent as possible, the judging committee will use the door decorating contest rubric when scoring each door. Here are the judges:

- -There will be <u>one prize</u> awarded to the class with the <u>highest total score average</u> within each grade group. Groups have been divided as follow:

- -Group C: 3rd Grade, 4th grade, and 5th grade.
- -Group D: 6th grade, 7th grade, and 8th grade.
