Kia ora Parents, Caregivers and Students,

Can you believe we are almost halfway through the school year? Time flies when you are having fun! This term has been busy again with classroom learning and a range of other wonderful activities. We've had our Creatives in Schools art programme run by Nicola Woodcock, Rippa (Wakatipu and Central), swim sports (School, Wakatipu and Central), netball tournaments, summit events, ice-skating, Clued Up Kids, St John Weaving Into Wellbeing. A busy term indeed. In fact, there is one more summit event coming this term, which is taking place on Friday (weather dependent) - An Orienteering Challenge. This is a whole day event, with students participating for their 45 minute Summit session. If you can spare any time during the day at all, to support with supervision of the control points and/or safe crossing zone, this would be greatly appreciated. If you are available to run a sausage sizzle on Friday lunch time, this would also be a great way to end our term - please let the office know by Wednesday mid day.

The amazing efforts of both students and teachers is always wonderful to see and Friday last week our Tuakana Roopu took out overall first place at Haka Tū Haka Ora! This Thursday at 6pm, we invite parents who wish to talk with us further on reporting to come to the school staffroom (through the office). Reporting of learning and achievement will be shared with parents through HERO, our student management system, on the first Monday of Term 3.

Parents & Caregivers must have downloaded the Hero app and logged into Hero to view reports. Please follow this link for 'how to sign up to Hero' information. If you have any problems, please contact the office.

Attendance - It is noticeable at this stage of the term that many children are arriving late to school. The first bell goes at 8.50am and we expect children to be heading to class at this time. This is an important time of the day where children get themselves sorted for the day, teachers talk about what's going on in the day and take the roll. We ask that all parents have their children at school by 8.50am. Being at school on time is a great start, the trick is to keep it regular over the course of a term and the year. Regular attendance is defined as being at school 90% of the time or more. Non-attendance adds up;

If a child misses five school days each term, one day a fortnight, they will miss the equivalent of one year of school over 10 years. As the level of absenteeism grows, the difficulty of re-engaging in learning can grow exponentially. We encourage you all to aim at having your child/rens attendance rate at 90% or better. This will have a direct benefit for your child/ren.

YEAR SEVEN VISION SCREENING

The Vision Hearing Technicians from Population Health team, Southern District Health will be visiting your school to screen all year seven students for distance vision on 27 July.

□ Distance Vision (Amblyopia & Hyperopia)

This determines how well your child can see at a distance. It involves reading an eye chart

(This free vision check is not required if student wears glasses and/or is currently under care of an optometrist or eye specialist).

If you do not wish your child to be screened, please fill out an opt-out slip, which are available at the school office before our visit.

If your child is already under-care / wears glasses? You do not need to opt-off as we will <u>not</u> be screening your child but have a note for them to take home.
