LOCAL EX-SERVICE MAN DIES IN WEST

Complications resulting from injuries he received in service during the world war resulted in the death of John E. McGoorty, 34, former Oshkosh man, at Soldiers' hospital, Los Angeles, Calif., Monday morning.

McGoorty had been confined to soldiers' hospitals two and a half years, for the last year at Los Angeles. Previous to that he was at Milwaukee.

He was born at Waukau, but spent most of his life in Oshkosh, and received his education here.

He enlisted in May, 1917, in the heavy artillery, and was sent overseas the same year.

His remains will be brought to Oshkosh the later part of this week for funeral services to be held at St. Peter's Catholic church. Interment will be at Berlin.

Mr. McGoorty's survivors include Mrs. R. J. White, Oshkosh, and a brother, James, of Chicago.

He was also a brother of the late Eddie McGoorty, at one time a leading aspirant for the middleweight boxing crown.
