<u>Key Skills</u>
I can use atlases, maps and globes to locate places and describe geographical features in my region and the wider world.
I can use digital maps (Digimaps for Schools) to observe, record and present the human and physical features in my local settlement using a sketch map.
I can create a sketch map (a simple, hand drawn map showing the main features of a place).
I can use the different features on Digimaps e.g. overlays, markers, grid references, zoom features and lines etc.
I can use the eight points of a compass, symbols and key, to build my knowledge of my local settlement.
I can use four-figure grid references to locate geographical features of my region. I understand eastings and northings.
I can use OS maps to locate geographical features. I can recognise OS symbols.
