

Screening for K-2 and Dyslexia

Universal Screening for students in K-2 will need to be administered as normal as well as any dyslexia screenings that may be needed. For virtual students, it has been suggested that districts schedule one-on-one appointments on campus for face-to-face screening for initial screening. If virtual screening becomes the only option, screenshot the student form of the assessment into a Google Slide to screen share with the student. Please be mindful that the validity of the assessment could be skewed due to internet delay in responses. **Level I** screening and **Level II** assessments should be administered **face-to-face** because accurate data is vital in detecting students' strengths and weaknesses in phonological processing and word-level reading. 6-12 Dyslexia

Strategic Reading for grades 6-8 may be used for both Tier II and Tier III reading intervention in the RtI model. Grade-level reading courses for grades 6, 7, and 8 may also be considered for scheduling Tier II reading intervention and Tier III dyslexia intervention. Critical Reading I and Critical Reading II in the RtI model are considered Tier II reading interventions. Academic Reading is strictly for students with characteristics of dyslexia and is considered a Tier III intervention. Early Career Educator Mentoring, R&R

Per the Arkansas Department of Education, the responsibility for planning and implementing an early career educator (formally known as novice) mentoring system was delegated to Education Services Cooperatives beginning with the 17/18 school year. As required by Act 295 of 2017, all early career educators are required to be mentored in their first 3 years of teaching through a DESE-approved mentoring program.

We are up to 832 early career educators in NWA! Thank you for partnering with us to ensure these teachers have the foundation they need as they transition from college/career to the classroom. We've worked diligently to ensure differentiation for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd year teachers as well as SPED, Counselors/Behavior, and speech-language pathologists. The cost of substitutes will be reimbursed at the end of the school year.

Our Recruitment Specialist, Dustin Seaton, is working with local schools who participate in the Educators Rising program to cultivate the next generation of educators, with a focus on recruiting educators that reflect the diversity of our student populations.

Our new semester began January 4, 2022. Students are back in zoom classes and working asynchronously in the Florida Virtual curriculum.

This month, students will be completing discussion-based assessments. Discussion-based assessments give students the opportunity to showcase how they can apply the skills and knowledge they have acquired during a module, or unit of study. Parent-Teacher Conferences for the Spring semester will be held at the end of the month.

SPED Transition

Arkansas Transition Services (ATS) will be hopefully hosting the in-person version of our Film Camp. The Inclusion Films Short Film Camp will be held the last week in April at Pulaski Tech in North Little Rock. Details will be coming soon.

Also, ATS is hopefully going back to in-person for our College Bound Arkansas. This is a 3 day on-campus experience for students with disabilities that are interested in attending college. Computer Science

CS is now a mandatory graduation requirement for all students starting with the 8th graders this year. I've been fielding lots of questions on how our districts can meet this requirement. Important Update: Schools with or interested in CTE CS programs of study. A change has been made that will allow students to complete any of these programs of study by taking **any** Year 1 CS course as listed on

https://dese.ade.arkansas.gov/Offices/ar-comp-sci-initiative/computer-science-standards-and-courses. This change was made recently and opens up options for schools who wish to offer their students a singular Y1 course before splitting into specific fields. This means Year 1 course requirements are now treated similarly to other CTE fields.

There is still time for schools interested in GoIT to be trained. This program meets the coding block standards, includes working with the Micro:bit coding tools and leads to a competition expected to go statewide this or next year.

Also, the Great Arkansas History Video Game Coding Competition is currently going strong. The submission window will open late February and close in early March. The theme this year is "My Favorite Arkansas Town" with the idea that every eligible student across the state could talk about what they love here in Arkansas.
