

2.5 Living in British Fort Vancouver

Lesson Plan for Grade 4 Unit 2, lesson 5

OVERVIEW & PURPOSE

This lesson continues to introduce students to life at the Fort. This lesson leads students through a brief research activity for individuals that lived there, including the McLoughlin family and kids that lived at the Fort.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. I can describe who was at Fort Vancouver during the time of British occupation and why they were there.
- 2. I can understand key vocabulary.

VOCABULARY (Word bank words)

- 1. **Chief Factor**: a person who is most important, the principal, or highest in rank or authority
- 2. **Fur (for trade)**: a piece of the dressed pelt(skin with hair) of an animal used to make, trim, or line wearing apparel
- 3. **Metis**: a person of mixed indigenous and Euro-American ancestry

MATERIALS NEEDED

- 1. <u>Lesson 5 Slides</u>
- 2. <u>Biography Summary Graphic Organizer</u> class set (plus extras if students want to research additional people from the lesson)

ASSESSMENTS

Formative and summative assessments

- 1. Student verbal contribution to class discussion

- 3. Biography summary

ACTIVITY

- 1. Lesson 5 slides lead class through vocabulary and discussion of life at Fort Vancouver. Allow students to add **vocab** words to the word bank.
- 2. The following slides include short **biographies** for several people that lived at the Fort, including John and Margarite McLoughlin, and several kids. Class can do a quick overview of the slides to introduce students to profiles and activity directions. Students can choose 1-2 people to complete the **biography summary graphic organizer**.
