

“Welcome to Study Stack! Asking your students to memorize for the sake of memorization can be a rather tedious process for them and for you because you might realize that the minute the test is over, your students might have forgotten everything. Study Stack allows you to create fun activities for students to remember beyond the lesson plan.

So you can go to [Studystack.com](https://studystack.com) and you can either log in or sign up. If you want to sign up, you can use your Facebook credentials. But if you do use Facebook, it is your username on Facebook that will appear on Study Stack's public forums. Or you can sign up with an email, it is up to you. Or you can just use the free flashcards that have already been generated. The only problem if you do that, your students will not be able to keep their scores, the scores will not be recorded. And also you would have advertisements popping up here and there.

The price of Study Stack is not outrageous. It is 20 \$ or so for a pro-account teacher account. But if you just want to save money and try this out, you can just play around.

You can use the flashcards already generated. Or create your own. But for that, you do need to create an account. *Scrolling down* There are games that will be created from the flashcards that you either use from Study Stack or that you create yourself. And that's actually a lot of fun if you cover vocabulary or maths formula in class. And then you have your students play with the activities there and therefore remember better what you have already covered in class.

There are different topics that you can browse. And you can download Study Stack on your smartphones whether your device is Android or iOS or play on your computer.

So it allows a freedom of use of devices, which I appreciate.

I also recommend that you look at the FAQ, it is pretty thorough, and it pretty much answered any questions you might have. As for privacy as I mentioned earlier, if you use your Facebook account, this is the name you use on Facebook that will appear on Study Stack but they are really respectful of the teacher and the students' privacy, which is very important to keep in mind where you are in education

So let's go back up and let's look for the flashcards that exist already so I can show you what we can do with that. *Filling up in the search box* So let's look for French. And I am going to look at vocabulary on employment. *Clicking on "Vocabulary on Employment"*. So, let's click on that. So what happens when you click on that link or any link. You would have the flashcards appear first. So, it is just a traditional flashcard, and you are timed to know how fast and how well you are doing. So the question is “what is the bureau?” I know it. It is the “office.” I am going to click “to flip.” Youhou, I am right. So, I am going to say “ I know.” and then you keep on doing that. It can be a little bit tedious. But, if you scroll down, you can see that there are different games. So, you can play the hangman for instance. So your students would be actually a little bit more advanced so they are not crushed by not knowing the answer. But what if I want to play something else? I want to do “Matching.” And then you would have in one color, here in French it is in green. Then in blue in English, you have the translations. So let's say I want to put the “salaire” with the “monthly income”. And then the “bureau” with the “office.” And then “le permis de conduire,” I am going to pretend that I do not know. I am wrong. And again I am timed here, which shows my progress. If all your students are doing that at the same time. That would be a good way to have them compete in a very fun way. And as I said you have different games. And they are all generated by the database that you would be using either from Study Stack or that you would be creating

I really recommend giving it a try. It would be fun for the students to actually reuse the vocabulary of whichever you have covered in class and have fun with that. Thank you for your attention and I hope you enjoyed this video. Bye bye.”
