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MAUNDY THURSDAY

The Gathering

All stand to sing the processional hymn.

PRIEST In the name of the Father, and of the
Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Greeting

The priest greets the people.

PRIEST The Lord be with you.

ALL And also with you.

Prayers of Penitence

The priest invites the people to confess their sins:

ALL Almighty God,
our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you,
and against our neighbour
in thought, and word, and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry,
and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ
who died for us,
forgive us all that is past;
and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life,
to the glory of your name. Amen.

The priest pronounces absolution, to which all respond:

Amen.

Gloria in Excelsis

Stand to say the Gloria:

**Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.
Amen.**

The Collect

The priest says:

PRIEST Let us pray that we may love one another
as Christ has loved us.

After a brief pause for silent prayer the priest says the
Collect, and all respond:

Amen.

The Ministry of the Word

First Reading

At the end the reader says:

This is the word of the Lord.

ALL **Thanks be to God.**

Second Reading

At the end the reader says:

This is the word of the Lord.

ALL **Thanks be to God.**

Stand for the gradual hymn.

The Gospel

PRIEST The Lord be with you.

ALL **And also with you.**

After the Gospel is announced:

ALL **Glory to you, O Lord.**

After the Gospel the minister says:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

ALL **Praise to you, O Christ.**

The Sermon

The priest delivers the homily.

The Washing of Feet

The priest washes the feet of representatives of the congregation.

The washing of feet ends with a prayer, to which all respond:

Amen.

Prayers of Intercession

All kneel if able; otherwise, sit or remain standing.

The priest introduces the prayers.

Prayers are offered for the Church, the world, the local community, those in need, and those who have died, and in silence we make our own petitions. At the end of each prayer:

PRIEST Lord, in your mercy

ALL **hear our prayer.**

At the end:

PRIEST Merciful Father,

ALL **accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Amen.**

The Ministry of the Sacrament

The Peace

The priest introduces the peace, then says:

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

ALL **And also with you.**

The Preparation of the Gifts

During the offertory hymn, the priest prepares the altar.

After the hymn, the priest says:

PRIEST Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this bread to
offer, which earth has given and human hands
have made.

It will become for us the bread of life.

ALL **Blessed be God for ever.**

PRIEST Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this wine to
offer, fruit of the vine and work of human
hands.

It will become our spiritual drink.

ALL **Blessed be God for ever.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

PRIEST The Lord be with you.

ALL **And also with you.**

PRIEST Lift up your hearts.

ALL **We lift them up to the Lord.**

PRIEST Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

The priest then continues with the Preface, ending with

ALL **Holy, holy, holy,
Lord God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he that comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

The priest then continues with the Eucharistic Prayer:

PRIEST Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,
and according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus
Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:

TAKE, EAT; THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU;
DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:

DRINK THIS, ALL OF YOU;
THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE NEW COVENANT,
WHICH IS SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS
OF SINS.

DO THIS, AS OFTEN AS YOU DRINK IT,
IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.

PRIEST Great is the mystery of faith:

ALL **Christ has died:**
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.

The priest then continues with the Eucharistic Prayer,
ending with the Doxology:

PRIEST And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the
cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins
of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty
resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking
for his coming in glory, we celebrate this
memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and
thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and

this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Catherine of Siena, St Mary Magdalene, St James, and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever,

through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

ALL **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

PRIEST As our Saviour Christ has commanded and taught us, we are bold to say:

ALL **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;**

**but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

The Breaking of the Bread

The priest breaks the bread, saying.

PRIEST We break this bread
to share in the body of Christ.

ALL **Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

The priest invites the people to receive communion:

Behold the Lamb of God,
who takes away the sin of the world.
Happy are those who are called
to his supper.

ALL **Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word,
and I shall be healed.**

When the consecrated bread is given the minister says:

The body of Christ,
Amen.

When the chalice is given:

The blood of Christ,
Amen.

After Communion

A short silence may be observed, after which the priest says the Prayer after Communion, to which all respond:

Amen.

The Stripping of the Sanctuary

The altar and the sanctuary are stripped bare.

Psalm 22 may be said or sung.

The Watch

The sacrament is exposed on the altar.

The people leave in silence.

The sacrament is brought to the Altar of Repose at St Catherine of Siena church.



The Vigil

The sacrament is placed on the Altar of Repose, and *Tantum ergo* is sung:

Therefore we, before him bending,
This great sacrament revere:
Types and shadows have their ending,
For the newer rite is here;
Faith, our outward sense befriending,
Makes the inward vision clear.

Glory let us give and blessing
To the Father and the Son,
Honour, might and praise addressing,
While eternal ages run;
Ever too his love confessing,
Who, from both, with both is one. Amen.

After a period of silence, Compline is said or sung.

PRIEST The Lord almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end.

ALL **Amen.**

PRIEST Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: whom resist, steadfast in the faith.
But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us.

ALL **Thanks be to God.**

PRIEST Our help is in the name of the Lord.

ALL **Who hath made heaven and earth.**

A period of silence is kept.

PRIEST We confess to God almighty,

ALL **The Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost,
That we have sinned in thought, word and deed,
Through our own grievous fault.
Wherefore we pray God to have mercy upon us.
Almighty God, have mercy upon us,
Forgive us all our sins and deliver us from all evil,**

**Confirm and strengthen us in all goodness,
And bring us to life everlasting;
Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

PRIEST May the almighty and merciful Lord grant unto you
✠ pardon and remission of all your sins, time for
amendment of life, and the grace and comfort of
the Holy Spirit.

ALL **Amen.**

The following versicles and responses may be sung.

PRIEST O God, make speed to save us.

ALL **O Lord, make haste to help us.**

PRIEST Glory be to the Father, and to the Son : and to the
Holy Ghost.

ALL **As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall
be, world without end. Amen.**

PRIEST Praise ye the Lord.

ALL **The Lord's name be praised.**

The office hymn is sung:

Before the ending of the day,
Creator of the world, we pray
That with thy wonted favour thou
Wouldst be our guard and keeper now.

From all ill dreams defend our eyes,

Psalm

PRIEST Have mercy upon me, O God, and hearken unto my prayer.

The psalm is read antiphonally:

1. Whoso dwelleth under the defence of the most High : shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

The priest reads the Collects. Then,

PRIEST We will lay us down in peace and take our rest.

ALL **For it is thou, Lord, only that makest us dwell in safety.**

PRIEST Abide with us, O Lord.

ALL **for it is toward evening and the day is far spent.**

PRIEST As the watchmen look for the morning,

ALL **so do we look for thee, O Christ.**

PRIEST Come with the dawning of the day

ALL **and make thyself known in the breaking of bread.**

A period of silence is kept.

PRIEST The Lord be with you

ALL **so do we and with thy spirit.**

PRIEST Let us bless the Lord.

ALL **Thanks be to God.**

The people may remain before the church for as long as they choose, before departing in silence.

The Gathering

The priest enters in silence, and lies prostrate.

The Collect

All stand for the Collect, to which all respond:

Amen.

The Liturgy of the Word

The priest introduces the Passion Gospel.

John 18.1-11 (Jesus is betrayed) is read.

My Song is Love Unknown (CP112) is sung.

John 18.12-27 (Jesus is tried) is read.

Jesu, Lover of My Soul (CP96) is sung.

John 18.28-40 (Jesus is tried before Pilate) is read.

Lord Jesus, Think On Me (CP97) is sung.

John 19.1-11 (Jesus is scourged) is read.

O Sacred Head Sore Wounded (CP119) is sung.

John 19.12-16 (Jesus is condemned) is read.

Drop, Drop, Slow Tears (CP106) is sung.

John 19.17-27 (Jesus is crucified) is read.

When I Survey the Wondrous Cross (CP127) is sung.

John 19.28-42 (Jesus dies) is read.

Were You There When They Crucified My Lord? (CP126) is sung.

The Sermon

The priest delivers the homily.

The Adoration of the Holy Cross

The priest carries the veiled cross into the sanctuary, and thrice reveals it, saying:

PRIEST Behold the wood of the Cross, on which
hung the salvation of the world.

ALL Come let us adore.

The cross is placed before the altar, and *Sing, my tongue, the Glorious Battle* (CP121) is sung.

Then, the priest venerates the cross.

Prayers of intercession may then be offered.

PRIEST Standing at the foot of the cross, let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us

ALL Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come; thy will be done;

as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.
Amen.

Giving of Communion

The priest invites the people to receive communion:

Behold the Lamb of God,
who takes away the sin of the world.
Happy are those who are called
to his supper.

ALL Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word,
and I shall be healed.

When the consecrated bread is given the minister says:

The body of Christ
Amen.

The Conclusion

A short silence may be observed.

PRIEST O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, set
your passion, cross and death between your
judgement and our souls, now and in the hour
of our death.
Grant mercy and grace to the living, rest to
the departed, to your Church peace and
concord and to us sinners forgiveness, and
everlasting life and glory;
for, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, you
are alive and reign, God, now and for ever.

ALL **Amen.**

Before departing in silence, all may venerate the cross.

EASTER VIGIL

The Service of Light

All stand. In the darkness, the priest introduces the service. Then, the priest blesses the new fire, saying:

Eternal God,
who made this most holy night to shine with the
brightness of your one true light:
set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring
us to the radiance of your heavenly glory;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

ALL Amen.

The priest marks the Easter candle, saying

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the
end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and
all ages; to him be glory and power, through every
age and for ever.

ALL Amen.

The priest inserts grains of incense into the Easter
candle, saying

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our
Lord guard and keep us.

ALL Amen.

The priest lights the Easter candle, saying

May the light of Christ, rising in glory,
banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

ALL Amen.

The priest bears the candle into the sanctuary, singing:

The light of Christ.

ALL



Thanks be to God.

The Exsultet

The priest sings the Easter Proclamation:

Rejoice now, all you heavenly choirs of angels; rejoice, all you holy ones around God's throne; let the trumpet of salvation sound the triumph of this mighty king. Rejoice too, O earth, in the radiance of this brightness; enlightened by the brightness of the eternal king, know that the darkness of the whole world has been put to flight. Rejoice too, O mother Church, arrayed in the brilliance of so great a light; let these walls echo with the joyful song of all the people here. And you, dear brethren, present at the lighting of this holy flame, I pray you join with me in invoking the loving-kindness of almighty God.

May he, who not for any merit of mine, has deigned to number me among his ministers, shed on me the light of his brightness, helping me to sing this candle's fitting praise.

PRIEST The Lord be with you.

ALL And also with you.

PRIEST Lift up your hearts.

ALL We lift them to the Lord.

PRIEST Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL It is right to give him thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and fitting that, with all the ardour of our heart and mind, we should acclaim with our voices the invisible almighty Father, and his only begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit. For Christ has repaid Adam's debt for us to his eternal Father, and with his dear blood erased the bond contracted through that ancient sin.

This is the Paschal feast, in which the Lamb is slain, he whose blood hallows the doorposts of the faithful. This is the night when long ago you caused our forefathers, the sons of Israel, in their passage out of Egypt, to pass dry-shod over the Red Sea. This then is the night which swept away the darkness of sin by the light of the fiery pillar. This is the night which at this hour throughout the earth detached from worldly vice and from the murk of sin those who believe in Christ, restores them to grace and to the fellowship of holiness. This is the night on which the bonds of death were broken, and from the world below Christ rose as conqueror.

Our birth into this life would have been no benefit, if redemption for eternal life had not been added. How wonderful the compassion and the care that you showed for us! How far beyond all reckoning the love with which you loved us, to ransom a servant, you delivered up your Son.

O truly necessary sin of Adam, blotted out by the death of Christ. O happy fault, that merited such and so great a redeemer. O truly blessed night, alone chosen to

know the time and the hour in which Christ rose from the world below.

This is the night of which it was written: “The night will be as bright as day; the light this night gives me will be all I desire. The power of this night’s holiness puts crimes to flight, washes guilt away, restores innocence to sinners and joy to those who mourn. Hatred is driven forth, peace is fostered, and the pride of earth rulers is humbled.

On this gracious night, then, Holy Father, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, which Holy Church, by the hands of her ministers, renders to you the solemn offering of this wax the bees have made. Now we know the praise due to this fiery pillar, lit in God’s honour from the shining fire. And though this fire has been divided, it has suffered no dimming through the sharing of its light. For it is fed by the melting wax, which the mother bee brought forth to form the substance of this precious lamp.

Truly blessed is this night, on which the earthly things and heavenly, human things and divine are joined! Therefore we pray, O Lord, that this candle hallowed in honour of your name, may continue bravely to dispel the darkness of this night. Accepted as a sweet fragrance, may it mingle with the lights of heaven. May the morning star find its flame alight; that morning star who knows no setting, Christ your Son, who came back from the grave and shed clear light upon mankind, and live and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

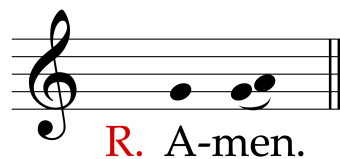
I come to Christ.

Prayer over the Water

Praise God who made heaven and earth,
who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest says the Blessing of Baptismal Water, to which
all respond:



Then all say:

**Springs of water, bless the Lord;
praise and exalt him above all for ever.**

Profession of Faith

The priest introduces the profession of faith, then asks:

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.**

On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.**

Amen.

The priest sprinkles water on the people.

The Vidi Aquam may be sung.

The priest says a prayer, to which all respond:

Amen.

The priest proclaims a blessing, to which all respond:

Amen.

The Mass proceeds as usual, with the Peace.

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
