Ralph J. Griedl, Veteran of Army Service, Succumbs

Ralph J. Griedl, 31, of 430 N. Lark St., died Tuesday at 4 p.m. at Mercy Hospital, where he had been taken earlier in the afternoon. He had been ill for the past three years.

A lifelong resident of Oshkosh, he was born here Oct. 10, 1927, son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Griedl. He was married to Miss Caroline Reif at St. Vincent's Catholic Church on April 7, 1951.

He attended Sacred Heart School and graduated from Oshkosh High School. An Army veteran of World War II, he was a member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church. Mr. Griedl operated the Ralo Beer Bar for three years before his illness, and prior to that had been employed by Kimberly-Clark Corp.

Survivors are all of Oshkosh, including his wife, Caroline; his parents; two daughters, Linda and Mary; two brothers, Louis Jr. and Roger Griedl; three sisters, Mrs. Wilbur Pischke, Mrs. Dale Cushman and Mrs. Albert Geen; his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Rudolph Gams and Mrs. Matilda Griedl.
