

# University of Arizona eWeek 2023

Please read this entire document for the rules and regulations for eWeek. ## Rules and Regulations

### Participating in eWeek for Clubs:

- All participating clubs/organizations must be ASUA, ESC, and College of Engineering Recognized.
- A club/organization consisting of over 50 members must compete as a group representing themselves. Clubs/organizations with less than 50 members have the option to pair up with another club/organization within the College of Engineering. Up to three clubs/organizations can combine if the total number of competitors does not exceed 75 people. Although the clubs are pairing up, each individual club must complete their own eWeek registration in order to participate.
- Competitors must also be registered members of the society/group they are competing for; competitors are allowed to only represent one group/organization per event. The eWeek committee reserves the right to make random checks of names against official member lists. Official member lists must be made available upon request. The obtained copies of these lists will be destroyed after eWeek to protect the privacy of club members. If a person represents two different clubs/organizations during a single event, both clubs/organizations will forfeit said event.
- All groups/organizations must also fill out the event registration form to register for eWeek by **Friday, February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 11:59 PM**; failure to do so may exclude the group/organization from competing in eWeek, even if the club does not wish to host an event. In the event that a club fills out the form late and is allowed to participate in eWeek, a 10 point deduction will be applied to their overall score.
  - Early-Bird Registration: Fill out the registration form by Friday, January 20, 2023 @11:59 pm and receive a 20 point bonus to your eWeek score!

- No damaging rooms or equipment. If organizations damage University property during an event each individual organization will be responsible for the costs.
- Groups/organizations do not have to host an event in order to compete in eWeek.

- Only students and faculty who sign in on an official sign-in form and state the name of their organization will be counted for participation points. Names are subject to checks against membership lists.
- Participating clubs in eWeek will only compete against other registered clubs for the the club cash prizes. Non-club groups will be present at events, but will compete for a separate set of prizes.

### Participating in eWeek for Teams (Non-Club Groups):

- The goal of non-club groups participating in eWeek is to allow all engineering students to have a chance to participate in eWeek. With that said, participating non-club teams in eWeek events must consist of students that are NOT competing for clubs/organizations at the same event.
- Each team must have a minimum of 5 members.
- The non-club group eWeek competition is a buy-in. Each member of a team must pay the \$5 buy-in fee to participate in eWeek. If member does not pay the fee, the member will not be counted and a team can risk disqualification from the competition. Directions for fee payment can be found below.
  - Each member of the team should venmo \$5 to Rachel, the Director of Finance, at [@Rachel-Turner-84](#). In the description, please include your first and last name and your team name. Your team will receive an email confirmation once it has been verified that everyone registered on your team has paid. If one person wants to venmo, only include the team name in the comment and the total fee is (# of team members) x 5.
- If there is a change in your team members, please contact Aaliyah at [aaliyahmazzeo@arizona.edu](mailto:aaliyahmazzeo@arizona.edu).
- All money from the paid fees will go towards cash jackpot for the first place prize. Once the prize is awarded to the first place team, ESC is not responsible for how that team divides the money among its members.
- All groups must register their team by **Friday, February 10, 2023 @ 11:59pm** using the form linked below. Only one person should register the team. All members must pay the \$5 fee by **Wednesday, February 15, 2023 @ 11:59 pm** or your registration will be void.

- All teams must come up with an appropriate team name. Submissions with an inappropriate team name will not be considered for eWeek registration.

- Non-club teams will be competing against other registered non-club teams for the total cash-prize created by the buy-in. Second and Third place will also be awarded prizes.
- For simplicity reasons, non-club groups will not be allowed to host events during eWeek. They are only allowed to participate in all events hosted by ESC and other clubs/organizations in order to gain points.

## Hosting an eWeek Competition/Event:

- Teams will receive 40 points for hosting an event or competition.
- Directions for event details submission can be found in the form linked below. Please fill out the form accurately and submit by **Monday, February 13th, 2023 @9:00pm**. You should receive a confirmation email that your event is approved.

- Clubs/organizations who do not provide their room assignment and event details for their respective event the day it is due (**February 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023**) will be deducted 20 points from their overall eWeek score.
- Any organization hosting an event will not be able to participate in their own event (if competitive). The club will still get participation points for each member at the event.
- If the event is competitive, events judged on a subjective basis require third-party impartial judging. Judges may not be affiliated with a participating group/organization. ESC can provide the service if necessary. The judging group cannot exceed five total judges.

## eWeek Points:

- If hosting a competition or an event, the hosting club/organization will be issued 40 points.
- When competing for events, points will be awarded as follows to clubs/organizations:
  - First Place: 30 points
  - Second place: 25 points
  - Third place: 20 points
  - Participation: 10 points

- Event participation points will be scaled by your total submitted active member count and the percentage of members that attend the event.
  - Example: If club A has 30 active members and 3 members attend an event, the club gets 30 points. The percentage of your club that attended that event is  $3/30 = 10\%$ .  $10\% \times 30$  points is 3 points. If the club had 15 active members, they would get  $3/15 = 20\% \times 30$  points = 6 points.
- Points will be deducted for cheating or unsportsmanlike behavior during any eWeek event. Cheating is defined as actions affecting the outcome of an event in a manner in violation of the event rules or the general rules. Unsportsmanlike conduct is defined as actions personally derisive to competitors or otherwise in violation of eWeek's spirit of friendly competition. All of the points accrued for a particular event can be deducted at the discretion of the eWeek Chair and ESC Officers.
- The team with the most points will be eWeek Champion.
- Club points for participation in events will be distributed on a weighted basis, where applicable (based on a submitted list of active members).
- Club points for the food drive will be distributed on an amount of food per club basis. Additionally, points will be distributed for food donations on a scale determined by ESC that will be released during eWeek.

### eWeek Prizes:

- For participating clubs/organizations:
  - First Place: \$500
  - Second Place: \$350
  - Third Place: \$200
  - Photo Contest: \$50
  - Tik Tok Video Contest: \$50
- For participating Non-Club groups:
  - First Place: Cash Jackpot from the buy-in
  - Second Place: TBA
  - Third Place: TBA

## Additional Rules:

- To protest point results, the president of the organization in question must contact the eWeek Chair by 12 pm the next day. After that time, no further complaints will be taken.
- Complaints must be submitted via e-mail to the eWeek Chair. Only the president of an organization may submit complaints unless there are extenuating circumstances (inability to locate the president does not count). No anonymous complaints will be considered.
- No nudity is allowed at any time during any eWeek events or for any materials submitted for eWeek.
- These rules are subject to change without notice. All changes will be posted. It is up to each club to make sure that they stay up to date with any possible changes that may occur.
- The Engineer's Ball will be the concluding ceremony for eWeek on April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 where winners will be announced and awarded. Each competing club/organization that makes the podium will be issued **two** free tickets to allow either a member and a date or two members to accept an award. If clubs combine for competition only two tickets will be issued to these clubs overall.

## ESC-Hosted Event Rules and Regulations (Work in Progress)

### 0.5K Run

- Event Details
  - Date: Friday, February 17, 2023 at 5:00pm
  - Location: The Engineering Building
  - 2 members from each club/team can participate for placement in the race. The first person to cross the finish line from each club/team will be counted and the other void. In other words, each club/team only gets one placement.
  - The start and finish line is at the engineering building. Students run from start to the flag pole, around the flag pole, and back to the start.
- Points
  - 1st Place: 30 points
  - 2nd Place: 25 points
  - 3rd Place: 20 points
  - 4th Place: 15 points
  - 5th Place: 12 points

### Capture the Flag

- Event Details
  - Date: Saturday, February 19th, 2023 at 12:00pm

- Location: Highland Green in front of Campus Health
- Teams will compete in a loser's bracket style competition. Each team needs a minimum of 5 players. Only 5 players will play at a time. Each team will play at least twice.
  - ESC can provide a couple substitutes if needed.
- Winning club gets not only a trophy and eWeek points, but bragging rights!
- No gear required!
- Rules
  - Set up
    - 2 teams, each with 5 players, will play at a time.
    - ESC will provide the flags for each team
    - The highland green will be divided into halves. Each half will be the territory of each team.
    - Each team will place their flag in a part of their territory in an area called the flag base.
    - To start the game, each team will start on the farthest end of their territory from the center of the field.
  - Game play
    - The goal of the game is to capture the other team's flag and return it to your team's flag base. By doing so, your team wins that round of capture the flag.
    - Your team is allowed to use strategy by assigning seekers and defenders of the flags. In general for:
      - Defenders: Players defending the flag cannot be within 10 feet of their team's flag unless an opponent is present in your territory.
      - Seekers: Players that enter enemy territory have to avoid being tagged by enemy players. If the player is tagged by an enemy player in enemy territory, that player must do 10 jumping jacks and return to their own territory before trying again.
      - In general, players cannot be tagged in their own territory unless they're in possession of the enemy flag; however, the previous rules still apply. Example: Red player 1 captures blue team's flag and returns to red territory. If blue player 1 tags red player 1, red player 1 has to drop the blue flag and do 10 jumping jacks while blue player 1 can recover the team flag. However, if red player 2 tags blue player 1 before (causing the blue player to do jumping jacks) and red player 1 returns the blue flag to their flag base, the red team wins the game.
    - Players must remain within the boundaries of the highland green. Stepping outside of bounds will result in that player being frozen for 30 seconds before returning to the game.
    - ESC members will stand by the boundary between the two territories. They will also stand around the highland green to watch for players going out of bounds.

## Food Drive

- Will be donated to the UA Campus Pantry
- Items to donate include:
  - Most non-perishables
  - Cereal
  - peanut butter and jelly
  - Canned fruit, vegetables, and protein
  - Rice and pasta
  - Water
- Points will be distributed on an “amount of food per person” based on your submitted active member count

## Coin War

- Each coin is worth positive points
- Dollars are considered negative points
  - Penny: +1
  - Nickel: +5
  - Dime: +10
  - Quarter: +25
  - Dollar: -100
- Only American money will be accepted and counted towards points
- Winning club gets to pick where the money is donated

## Photo Contest

- Showcase an event or competition that your club or team participates in during eWeek
- Up to 5 photographs can be submitted
- Scoring will be as follows:
  - First Place: 30 points and \$50
  - Second Place: 25 points
  - Third Place: 20 points
  - 3 points for every photograph submitted (up to 5)
- Last day to submit photos will be Friday, February 24th @8:00pm
  - Note: Your club or team does NOT have to post your photo on social media in order to enter the contest

## Tik Tok Video Contest

- Showcase your club or your participation during eWeek
- Challenge: Engineers can \_\_\_\_\_.
- Be as creative as you would like
- Can use tik tok or instagram reels

- Up to 2 tik toks can be submitted
- Scoring will be as follows:
  - First Place: 30 points and \$50
  - Second Place: 25 points
  - Third Place: 20 points
  - 5 points for every tik tok submitted (up to 2)
