Met</p> <p>PC 2 – Please provide specific evidence within a handbook, website, or other document that shows where fieldwork takes place in the program sequence, and evidence that no more than 9 units (or 12 w/ EL instruction) must be completed before the candidate begins fieldwork.</p> <p>It remains unclear based on the evidence provided the number of courses required of candidates prior to beginning fieldwork. Links to degree plans on the website list 5 core classes for a total of 15 units. Please clarify. The screenshot provided in the google doc is not legible. The spreadsheet listing virtual observations does not indicate where in the program it occurs.</p> <p>Met</p> <p>PC 4 – n/a</p> <p>PC 5 – Evidence provided frame primacy of CSET as way to meet subject matter competence requirement in both MS and SS programs. This is inaccurate and should reflect current options, including named majors, option to meet requirement via combination of exam and coursework, etc.</p> <p>Met</p> <p>Please provide evidence within a handbook, website, or other document that indicates the admissions criteria related to demonstration of subject matter competence required in the precondition. This evidence may be within any current authentic candidate materials where requirements are listed.</p>

This page includes the <i>regionally accredited institution</i> language, update program documents for consistency.</p> <p>Met.</p> <p>Precondition 2- The link provided for the Internship Option indicates that candidates must have passing scores on the CSET—page does not include that candidates have additional options for meeting the subject matter requirement.</p> <p>Not met. The only document that appears to be updated is the intern handbook, the handbook states “CSET scores or waiver (degree or course match)” Provide detail so that candidates understand <i>degree or course match</i>.</p> <p>Met</p>
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		<p>Precondition 3- The courses provided for the Pre-Service requirement include two (2) courses that do not appear to cover (a)-(d) as noted in this precondition. Provide link to the minimum 120 clock hour pre-service requirements in program website, specific page in handbook, admission form/ checklist, course descriptions, or other authentic program documentation that provides evidence of the preparation of interns in each of the listed preservice components (a) – (e).
