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# **Course Description & Expected Learner Outcomes:**

You have many more choices in terms of the genre you write in during this class. We will explore sub-genres of writing, will learn from mentor texts, dig into rhetoric, write individually, write in groups, engage in writers' workshop groups, and potentially go on a field trip. Grading will be centered around the **Six Traits of Good Writing:** Idea, Sentence Fluency, Word Choice, Conventions, Voice, and Organization.

- \*Deadlines are super important in the world of writing. 20% of your overall grade will reflect your ability to meet deadlines and/or communicate with your teacher ahead of time as to why you need a slightly different one.
- \*V1s will be entered into the gradebook to show evidence of progress (but won't be given a grade)
- \*V2 self-assessments will be entered into the gradebook to show evidence of progress against the Six Traits of Good Writing rubric (but won't be given a grade)
- \*V3s will receive marks against the Six Traits of Good Writing rubric (so that's a grade in the gradebook).
- \*Revisions beyond V3 are welcome. New marks will replace old marks.
- \* 70% of your final grade for the tri is an average of all V3 marks, plus 10% for your final portfolio, and 20% for your deadline grade.
