

LIGHTROOM IMPLEMENTATION #1

Now that you have learned some basic skills in Lightroom, it is time to implement them in your own photos!

Objective:

In this assignment, you will creatively produce a series of images that correctly utilize a series of Lightroom techniques and skills.

Guidelines:

Revisit the "[How to add, edit, and sync photos in Lightroom](#)" Lightroom tutorial to help remind you of the basic Photoshop skills.

Assignment:

1. You will begin by selecting five images (they can be ones you have already taken).
 - a. The subject/theme of your photos is your choice.
 - b. They need to be **creative** and **visually pleasing** images (remember, you should ONLY turn in photos that you're proud of...that you would print out, and hang on your wall).
 - c. **Upload the original photos to a Google Photos album entitled "Lightroom Implementation"**
2. **Before you import your photos to Lightroom, make sure to move the downloaded images to your "My Photos" folders in a subfolder entitled, "Lightroom Implementation." If you move your photos AFTER importing them, Lightroom will not be able to find your photos and will give you a "File Not Found" notification.**
3. Import your photos to Lightroom.
4. For each photo, you need to have the following edits:
 - a. Adjust brightness
 - b. Adjust specific colors
 - c. Use presets
 - d. Crop and straighten
 - e. Lens and perspective correction
 - f. Apply a graduated filter, or a radial filter
 - g. Use the adjustment brush
 - h. Edit your mask
 - i. Export the photo as a JPEG (make sure you rename the file so it does not override the original file)
5. To export:
 - a. In the "Library" module, click "Export."
 - b. Under "Export Location" select "Specific Location" from the drop down menu and find the "Lightroom Implementation" folder that you created (it should be on your desktop in the "My Photos" folder).

- c. Under “File Naming,” make sure to re-name the images so that you do not override your original files.
6. Once you have exported your five photos as **renamed** JPEG’s, upload them to your “Lightroom Implementation #1” album for a total of 10 photos (The five original photos, and the five edited photos).
 - a. In the “Add a Description” section **for the five edited photos**, answer the following questions:
 - i. What edits did you make?
 - ii. How has the image improved?
 - iii. What do you like about the image?
 - iv. What do you dislike?
