
FREEBORN CREEK CLEAN UP 2016!

The Coast and Creek Cleanup happens every year, on the third Saturday in September. People join together at sites all over California to take part in the international volunteer event!

Families, friends, coworkers, scout troops, school groups, service clubs, and individuals come together to celebrate and share their appreciation of California's fabulous coast and waterways. **This year, Cordelia Hills**

Coyotes will be sponsoring the cleaning up of Freeborn Creek, which runs right behind our school!

Students, families, and teachers will come together to rid Freeborn Creek of bottles, plastic bags, newspapers, aluminum cans, tires, shopping carts and countless other items that have been thoughtlessly strewn (or blown) along the local waterways.

Most of the **debris** found on our local waterways and coastal beaches actually **starts** as **litter** on streets that is **carried** into waterways and eventually **out to the ocean**.

Last year our local effort collected over **3 tons of trash** and nearly **300 lbs. of recyclables!** We hope to continue this stewardship of our creeks with the 2016's Coast and Creek Cleanup!

WHAT TO EXPECT ON CLEANUP DAY

The **site captain** will meet you at the site to collect your **signed waiver** form and provide instructions for a safe and fun time. Then about 11:30am, volunteers return to the meet up location to finalize totals. Upon request, scout badges and/or service certificates will be handed out.

Registration and Waivers

Adults can register online here,

or they can just show up on the day of the event.

Volunteers under the age of 18 must fill out a Creek Clean Up Waiver, that must be signed by a parent.

You can print a copy of the waiver from the link, or get a waiver directly from Ms. Wilcox. Once completed, you can either give the waiver to Ms. Wilcox, or bring it with you.

Waivers can also be signed on the day of the clean up, but parents must then be there to sign.
