ART CLUB

BANDS

■ JAZZ ENSEMBLE

SELECTION PROCESS: Students playing an instrument may audition in November

SEASON DATES: November – May

DESCRIPTION: Perform music in the jazz, Latin, pop, rock, and funk genres. Students compete against other jazz groups and participate in the Mid-Illini Festival.

MARCHING BAND

PRACTICE TIMES: Seventh Hour, Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and band camp during summer.

SEASON DATES: July through October

DESCRIPTION: Students must be enrolled in Marching Band class to participate. Students perform at home football games, some area parades, and in marching band competitions.

● PEP BAND

PRACTICE TIMES: During band class

SEASON DATES: Girls & Boys basketball-select home varsity games

DESCRIPTION: Pep Band performs popular tunes at all home varsity boys' basketball games.

Students must be enrolled in either Concert Band or Symphonic Band to participate.

WINTER GUARD

Indoor marching percussion and pit percussion – Includes playing music and marching for drumline members. Drumline is by audition.

PRACTICE TIMES: TBA
SEASON DATES: Winter

COLOR GUARD

Learn routines with flags to be a part of the Marching Band. Color Guard is an extension of the Marching Band and performs and competes with the PCHS Marching Band at all of its competitions.

PRACTICE TIMES: Same as Marching Band

TRY-OUTS: Spring

SEASON DATES: Same as Marching Band

NOTEABLES

PRACTICE TIMES: After school and/or evenings

SEASON DATES: January through March (competitions on Saturdays)

TRY-OUTS: May of each school year

DESCRIPTION: Noteables is an advanced show choir. It involves singing and dancing and competes with several schools within Illinois. Members must be enrolled in a curricular choir.

SCHOLASTIC BOWL

Scholastic Bowl is an academic competition much like the Jeopardy television show. The teams compete for toss-up questions to earn a chance at bonus questions on academic questions. Varsity has many Saturday competitions.

TRY-OUTS: End of September

SPEECH TEAM

The Speech Team is a competitive activity that gives students the opportunity to develop their skills in the area of public speaking, acting, and oral interpretation. The 34-40 member team is composed of freshmen through seniors. There are 14 individual events in which students can participate. In addition to the invitational season, there is the IHSA state series National Forensic League district contest and national tournament. Students interested in a future in performing arts, law, or teaching should consider this team.

THEATRE/DRAMA DEPARTMENT

The Theatre Department produces a fall and spring play every year, and musical every other spring semester. Students work both onstage as actors and backstage constructing the set, designing lights, operating sound, costuming the actors, and applying makeup. No prior experience is necessary. Any student can audition and participate on the crew.

BASS FISHING CLUB
