Supporting Your Child

Managing Difficult Behaviors (Part 2 of 2) AFTER the Behavior Occurs

- Actively ignore. Kids value any kind of attention from the important adults in their lives. When possible (not for aggressive or dangerous behavior) withdraw attention (including criticizing or raising voices) when a child starts to misbehave. Immediately give positive attention as soon as you see the misbehavior stop.
- Notice the child “being good” and reinforce by giving specific praise. For example, “Good job picking up your toys when I said it’s time to clean up.”
- Give consequences immediately and consistently. Natural consequences or ones linked to the behavior are helpful. They’ll be more likely to link their behavior to the consequence. This includes positive rewards/attention for positive behaviors.
- Avoid overreacting. In the moment, it can be hard not to overreact, but a consequence that is extreme can backfire and cause kids to give up trying or be demoralizing.
