President's Report (Jeanné Gardner):

2. **District will not be approving the resident subs at each site OR Period sub coverage rate of \$60 per hour for next year.**
 - a. We had a good conversation about this in the meeting and agreed that every site is using their resident subs. Cannot get enough sub coverage without having a resident sub. Resident subs are also used for intervention. We feel that this is not a prudent move by the district and we may need to renegotiate this at the beginning of 23-24.
3. MOU for 187 days for 23-24 and 186 days for 24-25 are being written and taken to the board for approval. These were ratified by the membership as part of the calendar ratification.
4. We have agreed not to change any of the language from the contract since last year we went through the entire document.
5. RE: SPED Language/Class Sizes/Collaborative Model
 - a. We are focusing on the work that Lucinda and the SPED department will be working on to write a handbook for the collaborative model for MS and HS. The district is working on getting some in-house training on this before next year, hopefully.
6. Calendar Negotiations
 - i. 23-24 calendar will not change at this time despite Emergency day issues.
 1. Issue regarding back to back late starts in Oct/Nov. This may be the only change.

 3. Have not heard back from the district about the waiver we applied for from the state for 2022-23.
 - ii. 24-25 calendar has been ratified and is awaiting board approval on 5/17/23.

 2. "S" days will appear as "E" (emergency) days from 24-25 forward.
 3. Remember that two week fall break and 5 day Thanksgiving break is back not next school year, but the year after.
- b. Effects of the Bell Schedule Changes

- i. We are hoping that shifting MS 10 minutes earlier (start and end times) and ending HS 10 minutes earlier (due to shortened lunch back to 30 min), will give more time for transportation to make it to the elementary bus stops on time in the mornings and afternoons.
- ii. Bus routes have also been recalculated for 23-24.
- iii. District is paying per diem rate to elementary teachers going over on bus duty for anything over 5 minutes. See emails for more details.
- iv. District doesn't think bus duty at the elementary sites is an issue. Should we have a form teachers can fill out for next year? We need data.
 - 1. Cabinet supports the notion that we may need to write an MOU to continue the per diem pay for bus duty overages in 23-24.
- v. Changes to duty day?
 - 1. Teachers do not feel that a change in the duty day will fix this issue.
 - 2. Not enough teachers at BLES to cover all of the AM/PM duties and still get the contracted minimum prep time (3 days @40 min per week); currently paying support staff on timesheets to cover morning duties, but DO no longer wants to pay this.
 - 3. Currently having a hard time getting to district sponsored PD, but BLES teachers are being told to figure out coverage when sometimes this isn't possible.

7. Union Elections
