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#### **Breakthrough Cincinnati's Mission**

Breakthrough Cincinnati (BTC) transforms the lives of young people through a one-of-a-kind summer learning experience that extends over four pivotal years. The six-week summer academic enrichment program gives rising 6th through 9th-grade students a boost through meaningful academic, leadership and college-preparatory experiences. Instead of losing valuable ground at school and navigating the temptations of an unstructured summer, students experience the program's "it's cool to be smart" culture.

## **Academic Elective Partnerships**

Breakthrough feels community partners are integral in helping our students and Teaching Fellows expand their understanding of the world. The wealth of expertise and passion for learning can not be limited to only BTC staff, thus outside partners are valued for their contributions. Together we can reach our aims and achieve our goals.

#### **Role of Community Partner:**

- 1) Provide activities/curriculum to support student sessions.
- 2) Meet with Teaching Fellows to complete 2 hr training, including a practice session prior to student programming.
- 3) Share resources to support student sessions and final projects.
- 4) Communicate regularly with TFs and BTC staff to ensure aims and goals are in progress.

#### Role of BTC Staff:

- 1) Provide session support with Teaching Fellows.
- 2) Provide evaluation support with the administration of evaluations.
- 3) Recruit 8-12 students per site to be a part of sessions and celebratory events.
- 4) Communicate regularly with Partners to ensure aims and goals are in progress.

#### Tips and Tools for a Successful Activity

Our aim is for the experience to be meaningful for Breakthrough Cincinnati students and for teaching fellows. Keeping the following tips in mind during planning will help ensure a smooth experience:

- View the planning and delivery of the experience as a collaborative venture and share plans often. [Academic Elective Planning Sheet]
- Environment, seating, group size, timing, materials, technology
  - Refer to Breakthrough staff for group size (typically 8 students per classroom) and a more intimate knowledge of potential groups dynamics.
  - Share resources and needs well in advance to ensure readiness for each session.
- Create activities that allow for a variety of experiences, both informative and hands-on.
- Develop activities, games or simulations that model real world scenarios.
- Draw connections to professional and academic skills. [<u>Curriculum Targets by Grade Level</u>]
- Plan more than is needed, things usually go faster than you think.
- Share ways to prepare students for their experience (dress, pre-discussion topics, vocabulary)
- Be flexible, kids are unpredictable.
- Have fun!
