Keywords: must be written in lowercase except for abbreviations, names of people/God, cities, or certain terms. Each word is separated by a comma, 3-5 words, and sorted alphabetically.

1. Introduction (Cambria, 12pt, bold)

The first paragraph under each heading and subheading should be left-aligned without indentation, while subsequent paragraphs should be indented by 1.25 cm. The introduction must include the general background, a review of previous literature (state of the art) to establish the scientific novelty of the article, a statement of scientific novelty, and the research problem or hypothesis (optional). The final part of the introduction should state the article's research objectives. Unlike research reports, the article should not have a separate literature review section. Prior literature reviews should be integrated into the introduction to demonstrate the article's scientific novelty. Use Cambria font, 12pt size, with 1.25 line spacing, and justify the text (left and right alignment).

2. Research Method (Cambria, 12pt, bold)

The first paragraph under each heading and subheading should be left-aligned without indentation, while subsequent paragraphs should be indented by 1.25 cm. This section covers the scientific theological research methods used to address the problem (e.g., hermeneutical methods). Only primary materials should be listed here, and they must include the title, author, and publisher (e.g., *Novum Testamentum*). The methods employed to conduct the research should be detailed in this section. Use Cambria font, 12pt size, with 1.25 line spacing, and justify the text (left and right alignment).

3. Result and Discussion (Cambria, 12pt, bold)

The first paragraph under each heading and subheading should be left-aligned without indentation, while subsequent paragraphs should be indented by 1.25 cm. This section may include subheadings with their respective discussions. The results and discussion section presents the research findings and their scientific analysis. It should highlight the scientific findings derived from the research, supported by adequate data. Scientific findings are not merely the data obtained but must be explained scientifically, addressing questions such as: What are the scientific findings? Why did they occur? Why do the variables trend in that way? These questions must be scientifically explained and supported by sufficient scientific phenomena. Additionally, compare the findings with those of other researchers on similar topics. The research results and findings must address the research objectives or hypotheses stated in the introduction. Use Cambria font, 12pt size, with 1.25 line spacing, and justify the text (left and right alignment). Subheadings in this section do not use a numbering system and should be formatted as follows:

Subheading (Cambria, 12pt, Bold, Capitalize Each Word, Left-Aligned).

Subheadings should be concise, consisting of 3-5 words.

Sub-subheading (Cambria, 12pt, Bold, Italic, Capitalize Each Word, Left-Aligned). Sub-subheadings should also be concise, consisting of 3-7 words.

4. Conclusion (Cambria, 12pt, bold)

The first paragraph under each heading and subheading should be left-aligned without indentation, while subsequent paragraphs should be indented by 1.25 cm. The conclusion should address the research hypothesis and/or objectives, summarizing the scientific findings obtained. It should not merely repeat the results and discussion but should succinctly present the key findings as they relate to the research goals or hypothesis. If necessary, the conclusion may also include suggestions for future research related to the study. Use Cambria font, 12pt size, with 1.25 line spacing, and justify the text (left and right alignment).

References (Cambria, 12pt, bold)

This section provides all of the citation sources. All sources cited in footnotes should be listed alphabetically in the references section. The bibliography must include references from primary sources, such as scientific journals, which should constitute at least 80% of the total citations and be published within the last ten years. Each article should have a minimum of fifteen references. References should be formatted according to the Turabian 9th edition style (full note), using Mendeley or Zotero.
