PenSPRA Excellence in Communications Contest - Social Media American Education Week Social Media Campaign

I. Overview

American Education Week (AEW) is a nationwide celebration founded in 1921 to recognize the contributions of public schools and foster community support for education. In 2024, AEW took place from November 18 to November 22, with the theme "Together for Safe, Just & Equitable Schools." The William Penn School District (WPSD) and the William Penn Education Association (WPEA) collaborated to honor educators, staff, students, and families throughout the district.

Our campaign engaged students, families, and staff across all 11 schools through themed spirit days, appreciation efforts, and a district-wide reading initiative. Each day focused on a different aspect of education, from celebrating school pride to recognizing Educational Support Professionals (ESPs) and community leaders.

II. Key Campaign Components

- Reading Campaign: A variety of individuals, including Superintendent Dr. Eric Becoats, Cabinet and senior staff, and elected officials such as Senator Tim Kearney and State Representative Gina Curry, participated in reading to or speaking with students in each of our 11 schools.
- **Spirit Days & Appreciation Efforts**: Students and staff engaged in themed dress days and activities highlighting teamwork, school spirit, and educator appreciation.
- "Why I ♥ WPSD" Contest: Families participated by sharing what they love about WPSD, with winners selected from each school.
- Educational Support Professionals (ESP) Recognition: A special thank-you campaign acknowledged the behind-the-scenes contributions of ESPs.

III. Outcomes

The campaign fostered engagement and reinforced the district's commitment to education, collaboration, and community involvement. The reading campaign, in particular, strengthened relationships between schools and community leaders while emphasizing literacy and student engagement. The Educational Support Professionals video was well received and appreciated by support staff throughout the district and students were excited to participate.

While we did not extensively track analytics, the campaign was well-received across the district, with participation from students, staff, and families in various activities

This campaign successfully highlighted the invaluable role of public education while fostering a deeper sense of pride and appreciation across the William Penn School District community.
