Placement Exams for the Major:

MAT 1010 will fulfill the math requirement for this major. You can register for MAT 1010 regardless of your SAT/ACT score and you do not need the Math Placement Test. Consult with your academic advisor if you want to consider a higher level math course for any reason.

First-Year Student Course Recommendations:

1. R C 1000 or UCO 1200 if there are seats available. If not, it's fine to take both classes in the spring semester.
2. Enroll in **ANT 2215, ANT 2230 and/or ANT 2221.**
3. Enroll in **MAT 1010**
4. Enroll in a course from the **Intercultural Literacy (ICL)** or **Sustainability & Climate Literacy (SCL)** category that has one of the following designations: Literary Studies (LS), Fine Arts (FA) or Historical Studies (HS).
5. Choose a General Education Wellness Literacy course
