Nebraska 6th Grade World Studies I: World Studies I: In sixth grade, students are ready to deepen their understanding of the Earth and its peoples through the study of history, geography, politics, culture, and economic systems. Students examine the world by exploring the location, place, and spatial organization of the world’s ancient civilizations. In this way, students develop higher levels of critical thinking by considering why civilizations developed, where and when they did, and why they declined. Students will have multiple opportunities to employ maps and timelines, to compare the foundations of economic and political systems, and to engage in content-driven research and inquiry. Students will explore the connections between ancient and classical societies and contemporary civic ideas and issues. Students analyze the interactions among the various cultures, emphasizing their enduring contributions and the link between the contemporary and ancient worlds.

Description: The purpose of Nebraska’s 6 Social Studies Standards is to integrate important subject matter and skills and to provide students a robust understanding of grade-specific concepts. The standards should not be viewed in isolation but as a unifying approach to social studies curriculum and instruction.

This plan and pacing guide recommends that teachers cover 4 core units. While teaching the units it is suggested that you follow the G.R.A.P.E.S model. Each unit should take about a quarter (40) days to teach. These units include:

- Beginning of Civilization (Early Humans and Mesopotamia)
- Ancient Egypt and the Middle East (Judaism)
- Ancient Asia (India and China)
- Ancient Greece and Rome

This all-year instructional plan acts as a framework for teachers who are new or transferring to develop a year-long curriculum map but also allows teachers to use professional judgment within their curriculum.

Goals:

- Study the world by exploring the location, place, and spatial organization of the world’s ancient civilizations.

Units:

- Unit I - Beginning of Civilization (Early Humans and Mesopotamia) (9 weeks)
- Unit II - Ancient Egypt and the Middle East (Judaism) (9 Weeks)
- Unit III - Ancient Asia (India and China) (9 Weeks)
- Unit IV - Ancient Greece and Rome (9 Weeks)
