The Caitlin Scarberry Memorial Scholarship was established to honor the memory of Caitlin Scarberry, a 2014 Santa Susana High School graduate, who died from brain cancer on October 16, 2021. Caitlin was a successful software engineer who worked for a very large tech company. She also had a passion for a large variety of interests ranging from fantasy fiction, Anime, video games, history, and economics to Broadway musicals, painting and crocheting. Everyone who knew her spoke of her kindness and brilliance. Some of her favorite classes were AP Computing, AP English and AP Calculus. Caitlin developed a love of computer programming at a very young age and taught herself some programming languages. She was a National Merit Scholar and received a Regent Scholarship all four years at UCSB. She was accepted to the program at UCSB which let her obtain her combined Bachelor's and Master's degrees in 5 years. She had hoped to go on to pursue a PhD after working in the field for a few years. She often spoke about being the only female in the room in her classes. Encouraging females to pursue this field was very important to Caitlin. This scholarship is designed to encourage female students to pursue careers in Computer Science and Engineering.

Scholarship Requirements: The recipient must be a graduating female senior at Westlake High School. The recipient must have a passion for computer science and computer engineering and a sincere interest in pursuing a career in computer science or computer engineering or a

field that is dependent on computer science. The recipient must be planning to attend a 4 year college with a computer science major. The recipient must provide a personal essay describing how their interest in the computer science field developed and their goals for their future on the reverse side of this application. One letter of recommendation is required from a teacher in the computer department.
