UT Austin Graduate Student/Worker Open Letter: COVID-19 Demands

Dear President Fenves, Interim President Designate Hartzell, Interim Executive Vice President and Provost Jaffe, and Graduate School Dean Smith:

We, graduate students of the University of Texas at Austin, call upon the university to take immediate and decisive action to support and protect graduate student workers, as well as other vulnerable university employees, in light of the COVID-19 crisis.

UT graduate student workers were already facing significant precarity before this pandemic. According to the Graduate Education Task Force Report which Provost McInnis released in January of this year, average TA stipends across the university have remained flat for the last 10 years, despite the fact that the cost of living in Austin has skyrocketed during this time. The majority of UT graduate student workers are paid *significantly* less than a living wage for the City of Austin, threatening UT's ability to fulfill its mission for excellence, as well as our ability to maintain a minimum level of economic security.¹

The already-precarious situation of graduate students at UT is now being heightened by the impacts of the COVID-19 crisis. Many internal and external summer funding sources have dried up, many research projects are indefinitely on hold, and students face delays in meeting major academic milestones. We are confronting the loss of career prospects in the face of looming austerity and economic recession, and we will feel these ramifications for years to come. These stressors, along with the fact that many of us have lost our supplementary forms of income and are struggling to meet basic needs, compound the mental health challenges of isolation. We recognize that many other campus workers -- including hourly and sub-contract workers, as well as contingent faculty -- are facing significant challenges during this time as well.

As graduate student workers, we were on the frontlines of implementing the university's response to this pandemic, from transitioning courses to online formats to shutting down laboratories and performing COVID-19 related research. Likewise, our work will be key to implementing startup procedures. We are deeply concerned about how UT is protecting and supporting its most vulnerable workers, as well as the prospect of a premature re-opening of campus before it is safe to

do so. We call upon UT to take swift action to ensure the safety and wellbeing of its graduate student workers -- as well as its other vulnerable employees and the wider UT community -- for the remainder of the outbreak, and any resurgence.

We demand:

- 1. A guaranteed universal one-year extension of funded time-to-completion for all current graduate students. Hundreds of institutions have extended tenure clocks for faculty members in light of the disruption caused by COVID-19.² The same extension must be made to graduate students in order to compensate for the inevitable present and/or future delays in research and academic progress.
- 2. The creation of new employment opportunities (in the form of teaching fellowships, lecturer positions, or other affiliations) for graduating UT PhD students. All graduating students will face significant challenges while entering the job market in a recession, and UT should dedicate resources to help students with career planning and accessing work opportunities in diverse sectors. PhD graduates in particular will face widespread hiring freezes and loss of academic job opportunities as universities implement austerity policies. The ability to retain short-term academic employment will help UT PhDs weather the decimated job market in the years ahead, and maintain UT's well-regarded record for PhD career placement into the future.
- 3. A guarantee that no UT employee loses employment or income due to the suspension of university operations, and that all workers required to be on campus are immediately supplied with personal protective equipment (PPE) and compensated with hazard pay. We stand in solidarity with essential workers and support the efforts of the Texas State Employees Union to secure safe and just working conditions on campus. Furthermore, as the university moves to reopen, PPE, especially masks, must be supplied to all workers, including graduate student workers and privately-contracted employees, as soon as they are required to return to work in their labs or other on-campus spaces.
- 4. Extended health insurance and expanded mental health access. Given the challenge of affording the AcademicBlue health plan and other health costs on low graduate stipends, UT should guarantee full health insurance coverage to all graduate students. It should ensure that no student faces a gap in insurance coverage this summer, or in subsequent semesters, because of shifts in their employment status. Additionally, the mental health challenges of the graduate community are deepening due to the COVID-19 crisis, and UT should work to expand student access to counselling services and remove caps on appointments at CMHC.
- 5. Reduced graduate tuition for the Summer 2020 session at the rate of 50% of the Fall/Spring semesters. Graduate students are equally affected by the current disruption and should be afforded the same tuition reductions being offered to undergraduate students, especially

considering that many UT graduate students in professional degree programs are required to complete credit hours during this year's summer term.

- 6. Additional financial and legal support for international graduate students. International students not only experience unique challenges in regards to housing, employment limitations, health insurance coverage, and federal aid, but also new fears and uncertainty about their visa status and lawful presence in the U.S. in light of the federal government's signals around COVID-19 immigration restrictions.
- 7. A strong, public stance against anti-Asian racism and resources to support students who have faced, or are likely to face, racist harassment. Incidences of anti-Asian racism have spiked during the pandemic. We demand that UT implement strategies to prevent racist incidents and provide resources, including mental health support, to aid students who have faced harassment of any form, or are dealing with anxiety due to the spike in harassments.
- 8. A commitment that UT will not reopen until national public health experts and guidelines indicate that reopening an environment such as a college campus is safe to do so.

 Last but not least, UT must not bend to political pressure in ways that put our lives at risk. We call for UT to develop each stage of its reopening plan in line with recommendations from the Center for Disease Control. This must include support for students and workers with varying levels of vulnerability, and mechanisms to protect students from PI or supervisor pressure to carry out work that compromises their health or safety. Prior to re-opening, UT must ensure it has the ability to implement comprehensive and rigorous protections to ensure the safety of the entire campus (and the City of Austin) community.

We demand that a written response to each of the demands listed above -- including a plan and timeline for how and when the administration will address them -- be sent to the entire graduate student and faculty bodies by May 27th, 2020.

In closing, we would like to call attention to the fact that many of these demands are being echoed by prominent scholars,³ as well as the professional organizations of our disciplines.⁴ The broader academic community has indicated that meeting these demands is not only the right thing to do in the face of this unprecedented crisis, but also crucial to the survival of academia as we know it.

We call upon UT Austin to place the well-being of its workers above all else at this time. Graduate student workers are continuing to organize with a growing coalition of graduate student groups around the nation, and we attentively await your response.
