Episode #2 at 42:29 there is reverse audio. When played forward is another link http://bit.ly/ogf4d

<u>Episode #3</u> repeats the phrase "Keep Your Eyes Open" multiple times in the episode and the phrase appears a few times on the episode's webpage. The episode also highlights a common ARG solving tactic of putting something (numbers, words, alphanumerics etc.) at the end of a known URL.

PW: Buckeye

Sorry. I'm pushing this webpage through a really convoluted backdoor, and that means I don't have great control over how it looks.

They don't know anything. Don't ask them.


Unless I've screwed something up,

they shouldn't even be able to see that this page exists on their own site.


Crawlers everywhere. I don't trust robots.txt. I can't be too direct.

If you don't know who I am then you missed something.


Stay close. Check back often. I need to show you something.

On Twitter, Francis_Dev01's location is **Session Storage**. Checking session storage on Chrome DevTools reveals the message: ep5 radio tuner



Kat has checked some radio static that appeared in episode 3, none of it seems to contain anything in spectrographic image. She also checked the spectrograph on the website, it seems to be audio of a person breathing.

Kat ran the first spectrogram we received through an analyzer and found that it was a voice saying "Nineteenth Century"


Note relating to the above: all spectrograms so far have used Linear scaling for their encoding.

A short episode (not on the Digital Folklore Website released on 02/22/2023. It's Title consisted of the following Morse Code Text:

Which, when translated, read:

"I NEED TO SHOW YOU SOMETHING. KEEP YOUR EYES OPEN. CHECK EVERYTHING. DON'T DISREGARD ANYTHING."

The episode itself consisted of the morse code message in audio form. There was also droning static in the background which, when turned into a spectrogram, depicted the face in the profile picture of <u>Francis's twitter page</u>. There is also an image of the Rosetta Stone to the left side of the spectrogram.



After this, we spent some time playing with the CSS of the website and were ultimately able to remove the semi-opaque gray background, revealing a field of stars. YankeeWhite managed to find the original image in the source code once we knew where to look (the image below is hyperlinked):

Following the discovery of this, Az reached out to an astronomer on twitter in hopes of helping us place the stars, in case they're related to a time or location.

Feel free to delete as we progress, but as of the evening of 2/23/2023 the clues we have are: Francis's twitter, the spectrogram directly above this containing both Francis and the Rosetta Stone, the "nineteenth century" audio from the original spectrogram received, and the star image.
