**Article** texts must be between **15** and **25** pages, including references and notes. **Review** texts must be between **3** and **6** pages. Use Tahoma font, size 12, justified, 1.5 line spacing. *Only foreign words must be italicized*. Use bold to emphasize or highlight text. Use quotation marks only for short direct quotes (less than four lines).

Citations must follow **NBR 10520 (2023 update)**. Short direct quotes (up to three lines) must be placed in double quotation marks, "[...] example of a short quote, up to three lines, following the text formatting with Tahoma font, size 12, justified, 1.5 line spacing" (Author's Last Name, year XXXX, p. X). If the authorship precedes the quote, use the format: Author's Last Name (year XXXX, p. X). Use [...] whenever part of the quote is omitted at the beginning and/or end.

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**Footnotes** (Tahoma, size 10, justified) must be included in the text for explanatory information, not exceeding 400 characters each. Use Word's reference tool for continuous numbering.
