**Keywords**: mention only specific concepts [word or phrase], crucial to the appropriate indexing of the papers, separated by semicolons (;), 3-5 concepts (Calibri font, 10pt)

## Introduction

[Arial black, 11pt, bold, left]

The introduction should outline the background of the research and explain why the topic is important and its contribution to the body of knowledge. Describe previous studies related to your research topic and the gaps in your research. Also, state the hypothesis (if using a quantitative method) and the purpose of your research [justified, Arial, 11pt, spacing 1.15]

## **Literature review**

[Arial black, 11pt, bold, left]

Literature review should consist of theories or framework used in explaining the studies and/or the assumptions or hypotheses, and should both guide and support understanding and answers to the research question/s. In the literature review, it is also necessary to exaplain the variables involved in the study [justified, Arial, 11pt, spacing 1.15]

#### **Research methods**

The research methods describes the stages and procedures for investigating a research problem and the reasons for applying specific techniques to identify, select, process, and analyze the information applied to understand the main research problem. In detail, the research method must explain the type and research approach used, the resources used, the data collection techniques, and how the data is analyzed. Describe the population and sample (if you use them), how the sample was determined, etc. [justified, Arial, 11pt, spacing 1.15]

## **Results and discussion**

[Arial black, 11pt, bold, left]

This section describes the results of the study. Results summarize (scientific) findings rather than providing data in great detail. Explain the differences between your results or findings and those of other researchers. Discussions should explore the significance of work results, not repeat them. The discussion is the most important part of your article. Here you get the opportunity to sell your data. Create a discussion based on the results, but don't repeat the results. The things that are important in the discussion section are: findings related to questions, research objectives, or hypotheses (what); the scientific interpretation of any results or findings you present is supported by the appropriate literature (why); consistency with what other researchers have found or discrepancies you have found (what else) [justified, Arial, 11pt, spacing 1.15]

## Figure and table

Procedures for presenting figure and table: (a) each figure/table must be accompanied by a figure/table number, and referred to in the text by mentioning the figure/table and its number; (b) the table title/caption is placed above the table, while the image title/caption is placed below the image; (c) table should not be truncated on other pages. If it is forced to be cut on another page, it must be given a continuation identity and given a table heading row; (d) vertical lines in table do not need to be displayed, while horizontal lines in tables are only displayed in table headings and closings; (e) it is recommended to place images and tables at the bottom of the text field on all pages,

while the text is at the top of the text field, to ensure clarity of text flow [Calibri, 9pt, single]




Figure 1. Growth in Sharia Mutual Funds Amount and NAV in Indonesia

Conclusion is not repeating result and discussion, but rather able to present the summary of the result as what is expected in the purpose or hypotheses. The author is also encouraged to write suggestions for the future research [justified, Arial, 11pt, spacing 1.15]

#### References

The reference list contains full details of all the references cited in the text of the article. It is recommended that they should be from the last 10 years and listed in alphabetical order following the American Psychological Association referencing style (6<sup>th</sup> Edition).

All the listed references must be cited in the text and all text citations listed in the reference list. A DOI for each reference must be provided if available. Author must use reference manager programs such as Mendeley or Zotero.
