Comfort and Basic Necessities	<ul> <li>□ Blankets or warm wraps for residents.</li> <li>□ Bottled water for hydration.</li> <li>□ Non-perishable snacks for residents.</li> <li>□ Adult diapers and basic hygiene supplies (if applicable).</li> </ul>
Communication and Lighting	<ul> <li>☐ Fully charged communication devices (radios, mobile phones).</li> <li>☐ Flashlights or portable lighting sources for safe loading and unloading at night.</li> <li>☐ Megaphone or loudspeaker for communication.</li> </ul>
Evacuation Route and Information	<ul> <li>□ Evacuation route maps and instructions.</li> <li>□ Identification signs for the bus loading area.</li> <li>□ Clear markings indicating resident seating assignments.</li> </ul>
Special Needs Considerations	<ul> <li>☐ Mobility aids (wheelchairs, walkers).</li> <li>☐ Portable oxygen tanks and supplies.</li> <li>☐ Communication boards or devices for non-verbal residents.</li> </ul>
Documentation and Accountability	<ul> <li>Evacuation manifest with resident names.</li> <li>Emergency contact information for each resident.</li> <li>Clipboard or organizational tool for documentation.</li> </ul>
Bus Occupant PPE	<ul><li>☐ Adequate masks and gloves for staff and residents.</li><li>☐ Hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes.</li></ul>
Communication	☐ Emergency radio for communication with external agencies.
