INTRODUCTION

The introduction is written in font Times New Roman, size: 12, line spacing: multiple (1.15). The introductory section describes the background of the research problem, literature facts, research gaps, and the purpose of writing. The problem must be clear and requires research to solve the problem. For Arabic writing or fragments of verses from the Qur'an, the Traditional Arabic font size is 16. Foreign language words or phrases are written in italics, while Arabic-Latin transliteration refers to Arabic-Indonesian transliteration according to the SKB 3 Menteri. The body of paper must be elaborated between 4500-9.000 words (maximum) including abstract and references.

These may include theoretical contributions, methodological insights, or practical implications for legal interpretation, policy development, or institutional practice. In the final paragraph (optional), authors may acknowledge the limitations of the research and offer recommendations for future studies. Such recommendations should be grounded in the study's findings and suggest meaningful directions for further research, rather than introducing new arguments or data. Authors should ensure that the conclusion logically closes the article and reinforces the study's significance within broader academic and socio-legal debates.
