We practised filling each other's buckets with kind words and even designed our own pink shirts.

Kea Puia learned how to be upstanders while holding popsicle stick props that translated:

Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora – Speak Up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying!

We promoted kindness and inclusion with Jim, taking turns and encouraging each other to shoot hoops.

The students wrote kind comments to each other and shared them with their whānau. They created 'No bullying' posters for their home learning. We also watched Oat the Goat and the story of how Pink Shirt originated.

I can be an Upstander, by asking "Do you want to play with me?" to interrupt the bullying?

If I see bullying, I can go up to someone and say, "That's not nice."

I can go and find a teacher to help stop the bullying.

I will tell the person being bullied to come with me to find a duty teacher.

Faith: Don't stand by - Be an upstander!


Ethan G: "The videos that we watched encouraged us to be the upstander in someone's story and make a difference."
